Whitehall, April 2, 1804. As feveral Artificers and Mainfacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kinydoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Tweir late Majestes King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who

may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artiscers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaid, fuch Juttice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affixes or Quarter Schoons, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforefaid, he shall rive fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be impailed till Security

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the
