W/E, taking into Our most serious Confideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a public Day of Falting and Humiliation be observed throughout those Parts of Our Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Friday the Twenty fifth Day of May next enluing, that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and folemn Manner fend up our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deferved; and for imploring His Bleffing and Affiliance on Our Arms for the Reftoration of Peace and Profperity to Us and Our Dominions : And We do frictly charge and command, that the faid Public Faft be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may juftly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty: And, for the better and more orderly folcomizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Moft Reverend the Archhilhops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compofe a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of public Worship, and to take Care that the l

fame be timely difperfed throughout their refpective Diocefes.

Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pais to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published ; and We do appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by an Act, paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May Oue " thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation " of Hides, Calf Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool " (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign Ships, on Pay-44 ment of the like Duties, as if imported in British " or Irifh Ships;" it is enacted, that it shall and neav be lawful for His Majesty, by His Order in Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as it shall be judged expedient, to permit, until the Fifth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and five, any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow and Wool (except Cotton Wool), to be imported in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of fuch and the like Duties of Cuftoms and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Veffel ; any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding : His Majesty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the l'owers vested in His Majefty by the above-recited Act, to allow, and doth hereby allow, during the Space of Three Months from the Date of this Order, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Veffel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of

Our Will is, therefore, and We charge, that this the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Veffel with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the fame Duties of Customs and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ships or Veffel .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions accordingly. ISPATCHES, of which the following are Copies, were this Day received by the Right Honorable Lord Hobart, One of His Majesty's Principal Sccretaries of State, from Colonel John - Fraser, Commandant of the Settlement of Goree, on the Coast of Africa:

My LORD, Goree, Africa, 5th Feb. 1804. N the 17th of January, about Noon, a Negro arrived from Yoff, and reported that a Fleet had been feen from thence that Morning, at Day

light, and appeared to be flanding for Goree. Before Two o'Clock Vessels were feen from the Hill behind Cape Emanuel; near Four they came round the Cape; the Squadron confifting of One Ship, carrying a Commodore's Pendant, and Five Armed Schooners, with Pendants, all shewing French Colours, and with large Boats towing after them.

The Commodore fired a Gun, and hoifted a Red Flag at his Foremaft Head, which we have fince learnt was meant as a Signal to us, that in cafe of Attack during Night, no Quarter would be given.

About Sunfet the Squadron tacked, and before dark was near the Anchorage, flanding in.

The Inhabitants having agreed to affift in defend-ing the Island against any Attempt that should be made from Seuegal, and being of Opinion that the prefent Force was of that Nature, such Measures were taken as appeared most likely to prevent the Enemy from Landing during the Night : All the Arms that could be procured were accordingly iffued to the Inhabitants, who, with the Garrison, were stationed at the different Posts round the Island.

The Moon fet at Eleven, and Affairs remained in the Situation deferibed until about Three o'Clock on the 18th; when shortly after I had returned to the Beach Battery from viliting the Polts, a fresh tiring commenced on the East Side of the Island from Boats, and at the fame Inftant a Schooner came in Sight, ftanding directly for the Beach; a firong and well directed Fire of great Guns and Mußketry was immediately opened upon her, and the People on board, being either wounded or driven below, fhe drifted on shore

In the mean Time the Boats, to the Number of Eight, full of Troops, had unfortunately effected a landing on the Rocks to the East Side of the Town, where the Surf happened to be unufually low, and having overcome the Force which was opposed to them, they had penetrated through the Town as far as the Main Guard, of which, after being once repulsed, they gained Poffeffion, making fome Prifoners. The Inhabitants having given way nearly on all

Sides, and the Enemy being now in fuch Force on our Right, it appeared adviseable to form a Junction with the Soldiers in the North-Point Battery, where we should retain the Command of the Beach, and be ready to check any further Attempt to land, until fome Information could be received of the Strength and Situation of the Enemy, to enable me to judge what ought to be done.

The Firing continued until towards Six o'Clock, when being yet uncertain what Number had landed, and in hopes that the Main Guard was the only Post held by the Enemy, I directed that it should be at-tacked by the Soldiers I had with me, which was executed with great Alacrity, and the Post carried, with confiderable Lofs on the Part of the Enemy; Men, wounded .- Total 75.

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on our Side it was less as to Numbers, but I loit the Affiltance of a very gallant Officer, Doctor Heddle, being that through the Breaft in the Attack, when Captain Lloyd was also flightly wounded.

We now learned that the Enemy had Pollellion of the Hill, where Captain Lloyd proposed to attack them, a Measure I should gladly have adopted ; but the Day beginning to break, we had the Mortification to fee them appear in fuch Numbers as left no Room to suppose these was any Probability of Succels, our Force being reduced, by Killed, Wounded. and Prifoners, to about Twenty-five Soldiers, Cap-

tain Lloyd, Lieutenant Chrifty, and myfelf. At this Time the Enemy's Vefiels were flanding clofer in, apparently to land a Reinforcement ; and the Inhabitants, feeing French Colours on the Hill, came to me, asking Leave to treat.

Under these Circumstances, and exposed to the Enemy's Fire on all Sides, further Refillance appeared vain ; I therefore felt it my Duty to comply with the Request of the Inhabitants, and fent an Officer with them, propoling Terms of Capitulation for the Garrilon.

The Officer who commanded the Storming Party having been killed, the annexed Terms were verbally agreed to with the Senior who furvived, to be communicated to the Commandant of the Squadron ; until his Anfwer fhould be received firing cealed, and we continued to occupy the Battery.

The Terms of Capitulation being confirmed by the Commandant Mahé, the Soldiers grounded their Arms, and the Place was furrendered.

We were informed that the Enemy's Force confifted of Four Schooners, which had been fitted out at Cayenne, and fupplied with Soldiers for the Purpole of attacking Goree; that they had touched at Senegal, where they had been furnified with additional Boats, Pilots, a Reinforcement of Soldiers, and another, Schooner and where they had been joined by the Ship, which happening to call at Senegal was put in Requisition for this Expedition: The Squadron altogether carried upwards of Sixty Guns, and Six Hundred Men, about Two Hundred and Forty of whom had been landed; the Whole under the Command of Moufieur Mahé, Lieutenanz de Vaisseau, the Commodore's Pendant having been hoifted only while coming in, by the Captain of the Ship, who had held that Rank in their Navy during the late War.

On the Evening of the Action we had Fifty-four white Men, including Officers, and although the Serjeant-Major was the only one who was not able to come upon the Batteries, when it is confidered, that feveral of the Men, worn out by Difeafe, and difabled by Accidents, were incapable of making any great Exertion, that uncertain where an Attack might be made in the Night, it was neceliary to divide our Force very much to occupy the different Pofts, I hope and truft it will appear to our King and to our Country, that the Garrifon I had the Honor to command, did not fubmit without dif-

charging its Duty like British Soldiers. Our Loss confists of 1 Drummer, 8 Rank and File, killed; 2 Officers, 8 Rank and File, wounded. Total 19.

Of the Enemy, according to the most correct Accounts I can procure, 3 Officers and 40 Men, killed, or fince dead; 2 Officers and upwards of 30

Captain Lloyd, who has already on feveral Occafions been mentioned as a deferving Officer, both here and at Sierra Leone, continues to merit very great Praise.

Doctor Heddle having propoled fome Time back to do military Duty, I gladly accepted his Offer, and he has given me great Affiltance; his Wound, which was at first thought be mortal, having taken a favourable Turn, I am now happy to think he will recover, and I earneftly with to recommend him to your Lordihip's Notice, as diffinguished by his Conduct on this Occasion, and also by his Attention to his medical Duties fince we came to

TRANSLATION.

Gorée, Africa, January 18, 1804. "HE French being in Polleflion of the Hill,

I the Squadron being ready to land more Troops, the Squadron being ready to land more Troops, a confiderable Number of Men being killed and wounded on both Sides, and farther Refitance offering only the Profpect of occasioning an unne-ceffary Effution of Blood, the following Terms of Capitulation were agreed to :

Art. 1. The Island of Gorée, with its Depend-encies, shall be delivered up to the French Government as it now stands.

Art. II. The British Garrison having laid down their Arms in the North Battery, which they coutinue to occupy, shall be furnished without Delay with a sufficient Vessel as a Cartel, to carry them to Great Britain, Colonel Fraser giving his Parole of Honor for himfelf, his Officers, and Soldiers, not to ferve during the prefent War, against the French Republic, or its Allies, until regularly exchanged. Art. III. The Officers and Soldiers shall preferve

their Baggage and Effects, which shall be embarked with them

Art. IV. The Inhabitants shall retain Possession of their Properties, without Prejudice however to any Orders to the contrary which may hereafter be given by General Blanchot, Commandant and Administrator General of Senegal, and its Dependen-.cies.

Agreed upon and executed in two Copies, to be exchanged between us, the Day and Year already mentioned.

MY LOND, N the 18th of January, in the Evening, the British Soldiers were embarked on board the French Squadron, until a Cartel should be made ready for them.

On the 23d, the Officers and Soldiers went on board a Sloop which was fent as a Cartel to Senegal, where a larger Veffel was preparing to carry them to England.

I am very forry to add, that not with flanding the Articles of Capitulation, the Inhabitants, Officers, and even Soldiers, have been fhamefully pillaged.


