# Admiralty-Office, May 1, 1804.

THE following are Copies of Letters which have been received at this Office from Commodore Hood, Commander in Chief of His Majeity's Ships and Veffels at the Leeward Iflands :

SIR,

Centaur, Diamond Rock, off Martinique, February 6, 1804.

I HAVE the Satisfaction to acquaint you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, of the Capture of the Curieux French Corvette, early in the Morning of the 4th Instant, of Sixteen long French Six-Pounders, and had on board upwards of One Hundred Men when attacked by Four Boats of the Centaur, containing Sixty Seamen and Twelve Marines, under the Command of Lieutenant Robert Carthew Reynolds; fhe was laying clofe under Fort Edward at the En-trance of the Careenage, Fort Royal Harbour, Martinique; he boarded on the Quarters in a molt gallant Manner, and was well aided by Lieutenant Bettefworth, and Mr. Tracey, my Secretary, with the other Officers and Men; the Enemy made a warm Refistance at the first Onfet, but the spirited and fuperior Valour of this brave Officer and his. Supporters drove them forward, where a Second Stand was made, which was carried with equal Gallantry : her Captain Cordier leaped overboard, after receiving Two Sabre Wounds, and faved himfelf, with fome of the Men, in a Boat that lay under her Bows, and got on Shore; only one French Officer escaped being either killed or wounded, and he was below; fortunately this brilliant Service was performed with only the enclosed Lift of Wounded in the Boats. I am forry to add, Lientenant Reynolds is of the Number, feverely, with Five Wounds; also Lieutenant Bettefworth and Mr. Tracey, though not badly.

BEG leave to inform you His Majefty's Sloop under my Command fell in with, and, after a Chafe of Eight Hours, captured Le Recompence French Schooner Privateer, of Ten Six-Pounders, and Seventy Men, out Fifty-five Days, and had captured the Mariana\*, from Glafgow, bound to Barbadoes. The Recompence was taken about Thirty Leagues to Windward of Barbadoes; her Guns thrown overboard during the Chafe. I am, Sir, &c.

I cannot fufficiently extol the bril-liant and gallant Conduct of this Officer and Crew.

## His Majefly's Schooner L'Eclair, Tortola, SIR, 10th February 1804

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that on my Return from conversional Return from convoying the Packet to the Northward in His Majefty's Schooner under my Com-mand, on the 5th Inftant, at Three P. M., the Island of Tortola bearing South, diftant about Sixtyeight Leagues, faw a strange Sail to the Southward, fulpecting her to be an Enemy, made all fail in Chace; at Half paft Three observed her to be a Ship flanding towards us.; at Four made the Signal, No. .275 to her, which not being answered, shortened Sail and cleared for Action; at Half-past Four, being within Musket-shot on our Weather-Bow, she hauled up her Courfes, hove to, and holfted French National Colours, when I discovered her to be a Ship apparently just out of Port, mounting Twenty-two Guns, and conclude, from the Number of Men feen on her Decks, as also her Tops, there could not be ilefs that Two Hundred. When we came within Piftol-Shot, the commenced the Action by firing her Larboard Broadfide and a heavy Fire of Mut-quetry, which we returned with the Weather Broad-ide and Mutaness fide and Mulketry; wore-round, hove to, and fired the Starboard Broadfide ; the Fire was kept up without Intermission on both Sides until a Quarter past Five, when the Enemy began to flacken her Fire, filled, bote up, and endeavoured to rake us,

but upon obferving our Preparations to board her, by manning the Rigging, the ceafed Firing, and made all fail to the Northward, on which we filled and made fail after her, keeping up a Fire of Mufquetry ; at Seven found her getting falt away ; at Half palt Eight loft Sight of her ; feeing there was no Poffibility of coming up, at Ten gave over the Chace, found great Part of the flanding and run-ning Rigging flot away, the Bulwark, Mafts, Yards, &c. much damaged, One Marine killed, and Four Seamen wounded, though the Lofs on the Part of the Enemy, I believe, from their apparent Confusion, mult be greater.

And, Sir, when I reflect on the Superiority of the Enemy in point of Force, I cannot fay enough in Praile of those brave Officers and Men I have the Honor to command, and from whole gallant Conduct and Zeal on the Occasion, particularly when ordered to prepare to board, I felt perfectly confident of carrying the French Ship in a few Minutes, on the Second Attack, had not her fuperior Sailing frustrated our Intentions

I should feel unmindful of my Duty, was I to omit reprefenting to you the great Affiltance I re-ceived from Mr. Salmon the Mafter, on this, as well as on every other Occasion.

BEG to inform you, that this Day, in the Latitude of Barbadoes, and Forty Leagues to Windward, His Majefty's Ship under my Command fell in with, and, after a long Chace, took Poffeffion of the French Armed Schooner Flebustier, pierced for Fourteen Guns, had Six French Sixes, and Sixty-eight Men on board ; fhe is new, fails remarkably fait, and was flored for a long Cruize, from Guadaloupe; out Fifteen Days, and I could not learn she had made a Capture.

# Centaur, Carlifle-Bay, Barbadoes, 22d March 1804.

T BEG leave to enclose you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, an Account from Captain O'Bryen, of His Majesty's Ship Emerald, and Lieutenant Forrelt, of the Capsture of the Molambique French Schooner Privateer, of Ten Eighteen Pounder Carronades, from under the Batteries, near the Pearl, which was executed in a most spirited and steady Manner by Lieutenant Forrefl, and those that accompanied him in the Fort-Diamond, on this Service.

I also fend Copy of a Letter from Captain Ferris, acting in His Majesty's Ship Blenheim, giving an Account of Two Boats of that Ship, under Lieutenant Furber, attacking the Curieuse French Na--tional Schooner, moored, and, I have fince learned, chained to the Beach, under a Battery at St. Pierres.

I likewife fubjoin the Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant King, First of this Ship, now acting in mis Majefty's Sloop Drake, to Captain Nafa, commarding the Blockade of the North Part of the Ifland of Martinique, giving an Account of his carrying, with Thirty Men only, the Fort at Trinité, when opposed to much superior Force.

## His Majefty's Sloop Drake, off Trinitie, SIR, 25th February 1804.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that on the Night of the 19th Instant, Lieutenant Compston and Mr. Robfon, Mafter, voluntarily offered to bring out of the Harbour of Trinitie, Three American Veffels, that were taking in Cargoes, in Defiance of the Blockade, which they attempted in a very gal-lant Manner, having Polleflion of Two Brigs and a Schooner, under the Fire of the Fort, for a confiderable Time, but from having no Wind, could fuc-ceed only in bringing out the Schooner.

The Anchorage being within Pikol-Shot of the Fort, I faw no Probability of Succefs if another Effort was made, unlefs the Fort was reduced; for which Purpofe I, laik Night, landed with Thirty Men, including Nine Marines, and fucceeded in fpiking the Guns. Three Thirty-two-Pounders, and Two Field-Picces, which commanded the Entrance into the Fort.

I am forry to add, One Seaman expired from his Wound this Morning, and that Lieutenant Compfton and One Seaman, are each wounded in the Arm, but are doing very well, which are all that were hurt on the Occasion.

Blenheim, March 5, 1804. SIR. BEG Leave to acquaint you, Two Bosts (the Barge and Pinnace) of His Majelty's Ship under my Command, with Fifty Officers and Men, under the Orders of Licutenant Furber, on the Night of the 4th, made a most gailant, but unsucceisful Attempt, to cut out a French National Schooner, laying close under a Fort at the Town of St. Fierre. She had made formidable Preparations ; her Board- Circumitance that took place, which has excited Ad-ing Nettings being traced up to the lower Maft miration and Emulation in the Breath of the Specia-

Heads, and fo fastened, that it was almost impossible to get in, and her Sweeps rigged out on each Side ; notwithstanding all this, and the Beach lined with Soldiers, the Forts, an armed Sloop, and feveral other small Vessels near, keeping up a heavy Fire of Guns and Mulquetry, those brave Officers and Men in the Two Boats, perfevered and cut her Cables, but it being perfectly calm, fhe fwung and grounded on the Beach, when all Hopes of bringing her out were given up, and from the Number killed and wounded, as per enclosed Lift, the Commanding Officer very properly ordered the Boats off.

I lament fincerely our Lofs, but I truft you, Sir, will think the Character of British Seamen was well fupported on this Occasion, for furely never was greater Spirit displayed.

SIR, March 13, 1854. HAVE the Honor to enclose you a Letter I have received for the termination of the second seco have received from Lieutenant Forreit, First Lieutenant of His Majefty's Ship under my Com-mand, who I this Morning fent, accompanied by Thirty Volunteers, on board the Fort-Diamond Armed Sloop, with Directions to work to Windward Seas, to enable the Sloop to Weather the Pear? Rock, and to bear down on an Armed Schooner, which had, finding it impoflible to get into St. Pierres, this Ship being to Leeward, anchored clofe in Shore, under the Cover of the Battery at Seron. I at the fame Time fent the Boats of this Ship in a different Direction, in order to take off the Attention of the Battery from the Manœuvre in Contemplation, to be performed by Lieutenant Forreft.

It affords me particular Satisfaction to bear Teitimony to the handfome and gallant Manner in which this Service was performed, Lieutenant Forrest having laid the National Schooner on board under a heavy Fire from her and the Battery.

In the Performance of this Service great Judg. ment was exhibited, as, by the Mode of doing it. a Chain, by which the was faftened to the Shore, was broke, Twenty Feet of which is now hanging to the Echooner's Bow. The Crew of this Veffel, finding it impossible to withihand British Intrepidity, jamped overheard and fwam ashore, which they were enabled to do from her being moored clofe to it. It affords me particular Pleafure to inform you, Sire

that this gallant Service was performed without any Lofs on our Part, Two Men only being flightly wounded. I have been rather more circumicantial in this Detail, then perhaps the mere Capture of a Privateer justifies, but I feel I should not do Justice to the gallant Conduct of Lieutenant Forreit, the Judgment he exhibited, the brave and cool Conduct of the petty Officers and Men under his Command, which he speaks of in high Terms, had I neglected relating every

SIR, Fort-Diamond, March 13, 1804. I HAVE the Honor to inform you that, acting according to your Directions, in His Majefty's Armed Sloop Fort-Diamond, I had the good Fortune to fucceed in bringing out the Enemy's Privateer Schooner Mofambique from under the Bat-teries contiguous to the Pearl; fhe is pierced for Fourteen Guns, and mounted with Ten Eighteen-Ppunders: On feeing us determined to board, her Crew deferted her, after discharging her Broadfide and Musquetry; and I observed about Sixty Whites and Blacks in the Water after I had gained Poffeffion ; but as you were an Eye-witness to the Service, I can do no more than recommend the Officers and Men you did me the Honor to place under my Command to your most particular Notice, for their gallant and intrepid Conduct, while flanding through the Enemy's Fire, and their Activity and orderly Behaviour after Poffeffion. I found her fecured with Two Cables and a Chain to the Shore ; the former we cut, and the latter fhe fortunately broke by the Shock in boarding. I have the Happiness to in-form you, that we have futfered no Loss.
