TATE, taking into Our most serious Consideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have resolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a public Day of Fasting and Humiliation be observed throughout those Parts of Our Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Friday the Twenty-sisth Day of May next ensuing, that so both We and Our People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain related to both we and Our People may humble Our-felves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and folemn Mauner send up our Prayers and Supplica-tions to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring His Blessing and Assistance on Our Arms for the Restor-ation of Peace and Prosperity to Us and Our Daation of Peace and Prosperity to Us and Our Do-minions: And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Public Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of such Punishment as We may justly instict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty: And, for the better and more orderly folemnizing And, for the better and more orderly intermizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of public Worship, and to take Care that the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioceles.

IN E, taking into Our most serious Consideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have resolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a public Day of Fasting and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain colled Secondary Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the Seventh Day of June next ensuing, that so both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and solemn Manner, send up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring His Blessing and Assistance on Our Arms, for the Restoration of Peace and Prosperity to Us and Our Dominions: And We do strictly charge and command, That the faid Public Fait be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty, Our Will is, therefore, and We charge, that this Our Proclamation seen, ye forthwith pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, that Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the same published; and We do appoint them to send Coris hereof to the several Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above mentioned, the same may be published,

and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Seffion of Parliament, initialed "An Act of for permitting, until the Fifth Lay of May One thousand eight human and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Sking, Horns, Tellow, and Wool of W. W. D. Francisco and Parliaments. (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships;" it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by His Order in Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as it shall be judged expedient, to permit, until the Fifth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and five, any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), to be imported in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of such and the like Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel; any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding: His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majelty by the above-recited f. ct, to allow, and doth hereby allow, during the Space of Three Months from the Date of this Order, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undressed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Velici with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Cultoms and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vesse! —And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions accordingly. lash, in the Island of Arran, is mentioned as the Place for the Performance of Quarantine by Veffels arriving at the Port of Greenock liable thereto; and that Holy Lock, in the Firth of Clyde, is a more convenient Place for the Performance thereof, His Majesty is therefore pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all such Ships or Vessels as are or shall be bound to the Port of Greenock, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, shall perform their Quarantine in Holy Lock, in the Firth of Ciyde, in place of Lamlash, in the Island of Arran; and that all Goods imported on board such Ships shall be aired at the same Place .-- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majelly's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them Steph. Cottrell. may respectively appertain.

ITIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint La Charles Cameron, Esq. Captain-General and Governor in Chief of the Bahama Islands, he this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken by the Governors of His Majesty's Plantations.

HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, anti-thorised by virtue of 'His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Assagreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the Sum of Eight Millions by Loans or Exchequer-Bills, for the Service of Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and four.

An Act for raising the Sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Pounds by Loans or Exchequer-Bills, for the Service of Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and sour.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, for granting to His Majesty a Contribution on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, as requires Attornies, Agents, and Factors to retain and pay the Duties chargeable upon Public Annuities; and to extend the Times for nearing Appeals on Assessments or Surcharges made in pursuance of the said Act.

An Act to amend and continue, until the Twentyfifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and seven, so much of an Act made in the Fortysirst Year of His present Majesty as relates to allowing British Plantation Sugar to be warehoused.

An Act to amend and continue several Laws relating to the allowing the Importation of Rape Seed, and other Seeds used for extracting Oil, whenever the Prices of Middling British Rape Seed shall be above a certain Limit; to the allowing the Importation of Seal-Skins, cured with Foreign Salt, free of Duty, to the Twenty-fourth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and nine, and to the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries, to the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thoufand eight hundred and fix; and to continue several Laws relating to the allowing the Use of Salt Duty free in the preserving of Fish in Bulk or in Barrels, and to the discontinuing the Bounty payable on White Herrings exported, to the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and nine; to the permitting Sir William Bishop, George Bifhop, and Argles Bishop to carry on the Manufacfacture of Maiditone Geneva to the Fifth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and nine; and to the Admission to Entry of Oil and Blubber of Newsoundland taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from and residing in the said Island, to the Twenty fifth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and five.

An Act for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Clothing of the Militia in Great Britain, for the Year One thousand eight hundred and sour.

An Act to revive and further continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five, and amend so much of an Act made in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesly, as grants certain Allowances to Adjutants and Serjeant-Majors of the Militia of England, disembodied under an Act of the same Session of Parliament.

An Act for defraying, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five, the Charge of the Pay and Clothing of the Militia of Ireland; for holding Courts Martial on Serjeant-Majors, Serjeants, Corporals, and Drummers for Offences committed during the Time such Militia shall not be embodied; and for making Allowances in certain Cases to Subaltern Officers of the said Militia during Peace.

An Act for empowering His Majesty for a Time, and to an Extent therein limited, to accept the Services of such Parts of it is Militia Forces in Ireland as may voluntarily offer themselves to be employed in Great Britain.

An Act for empowering His Majesty to direct the Augmentation of His Militia Forces in Ireland to an Extent therein limited.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the last Seffion of Parliament for making Provision for the Wives and Families of Militia-Men of Ireland.

An Act to amend an Act made in the Fortyfecond Year of His present Majesty, to amend the Laws for the better Regulation of the Linen Manufacture in Ireland.

An Act to exempt Vessels in the Newsoundland Trade from the Provisions of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament for regulating Vessels carrying Passengers from the United Kingdom. An A& to enforce the line Observance of the Canons and Rubrick respecting the Ages of Persons to be admitted into the Secret Orders of Deach and Priest.

An Act for further increasing the Capital Stock of the Governor and Company of the Bank of Scotland.

An Act for increasing the Rotes of Schillening to be paid to Innkeepers and others on quarterly Soldiers.

An Act for enabling the Company of Provide tors of the Brecknock and Along toward Could's raife a further Sum of Money for annothing the faid Canal, and the Works thereinto belonging, and for altering and enlarging the Powers of as the made in the Thirty-third Year of His medical Petropetry for making the faid Canal.

An A& for paving, elevaling, lighting, and watching the Streets. Lanes, and other public Pathages and Places within the Town of Military and Sittingborne, in the County of Rent 1 and for removing and preventing Lacronchirents, Outlinestions, Nullances, and Annoyances therein.

An Act for the better defraying the Charges of preserving the Peace within the City of Dullin, and the District thereof, and establishing a parochief Watch therein.

An Act for draining and improving certain Fen Lands and Low Grounds within the Parishes of Ramsey and Bury, in the County of Huntingson.

An Act for railing an additional Sum of Monoy for carrying into Execution feveral Acts for widening the Entrance into the City of London new Temple-Bar; for making a more commodious Street at Snow-Hill; and for railing, on the Credit of the Orphan's Fund, certain Sums of Money for those Purposes; and also for enlarging the Powers of the said Acts.

An Act to alter and amend Two Acts, paffed in the Nineteenth and Thirty-fifth Years of His prefent Majesty, for repairing the Roads from Wigan to Presson, in the County-Palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for continuing the Term and Powers of Two Acts of the Third and Twenty-third Years of His present Majesty, so far as relate to the Road leading from the Town of Stafford to Sandon, in the County of Stafford, and from the faid Town of Stafford, through Bridgford and Eccleshall, to a Place called Ireland's Cross near Woore, in the County of Salop; and from Bridgford aforefaid, to a certain Stone which divides the Liberty of Ranton and Ellenhall in the Road between Bridgford and Newport, being the First Division of Ranton and Acts mentioned.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering the Powers of Two Acts, of the Twomy-eighth Year of King George the Second, and the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Mejady, to far as reinte to the Roads from the Hand and Pol at the Top of Lurford-Lane, in the County of Gloucefter, to Stow on the Wold, and from thence to Pacida Brook; and from the Crofs Hands on Salford Hill, in the County of Oxford, to the Hand and Pol in the Parish of Withington, in the County of Gloucester.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of Two Acts, made in the Third and Twenty-third Years of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from the Town of Stafford to Sandon, in the County of Stafford, and several other Roads in the Counties of Salop and Stafford, so far as the same relate to the Third District of Roads therein mentioned.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed, for repairing the Roads from a Place called Littlegate, at the Top of Leadenham Hill, in the County of Lincoln, to the West End of Barnby Gate, in Newark-upon Trent; and from the Guide Post at the Division of Kelham and Muskham Lanes, to Manssield; and from Southwell to Oxton, in the County of Nottingham; and for repairing the Road from the West Side of Newark Bridge to the said Guide Post.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts, made in the Second and Twenty-third Years of His present Majesty, for repairing the several Roads leading from Cleobury Mortimer, the Cross Houses, Giazeley, and the Turnpike Gate on Abberley Hill, in the Counties of Salop and Worcester.

An Act for continuing the Term and enlarging the Powers of so much of an Act, made in the Twenty-ninth Year of His present Majesty, as relates to the Road from Montrose to Brechin, in the County of Forfar.

An Act for the better amending and repairing of the Roads leading from the Lower Market-House in Tavistock, to Old Town-Gate, in the Borough of Plymouth; and from Manadon Gate to the Old Pound near Plymouth-Dock, in the County of Devon.

An Act for the more effectually repairing and improving the Road from Stockport, in the County of Chefter, to Saxon's Lane End, in the County-Palatine of Lancaster, and other Roads therein mentioned, in the Counties of Chefter and Lancaster, and in the County of York.

An Act to continue the Term, and alter and enlarge the Powers of Two Acts passed for amending the Road from the North Gate of the City of Wincheller, over Worthy Cowdown, to Newtown-River; and also the Road from Worthy Cowdown aforesaid to the Turnpike-Road at Andover, in the County of Southampton.
