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Barwick, May 12.

THis Morning was seen coming off from Sea, and Cruising before this Barr a Vessel which we suppose to be a Dutch Privateer. A person arriving yesterday from *Leith* informes us, that Captain *Hamilton* a Scotch Privateer of 22 Guns, belonging to *Dundee*, hath lately taken a Dutch Vessel of thirty Bras Guns.

Edenburgh, May 9. Captain *Henry* a Privateer, has lately brought up to *Leith* two prizes of an 100 Tuns a piece, one laden with Masts and Timber, the other with Wine and Brandy: another prize is also brought up, but we know not yet to whom she belongs, or what her lading is.

Dantzick, May 7. Letters of the 29th past, from *Warsaw*, advise us, That the Diet is in all probability like to have better effect then was by divers persons expected; That 2 day or two was like to put an end to that Session; that the 25 and 26th past, were employed in hearing Complaints, and censuring such persons as were known to be over-active for the Election of a Successor to that Crown, and for the bringing in some French Forces into the Kingdom, without the consent of the Republick, which Debates occasioned many heats in the Diet, but concluded peaceably.

From *Riga* we are advertised by Letters of the 29th of April, that the Senate at *Mosco*, have lately taken into their consideration the Complaints of their Merchants, against the Incroachments of Strangers, and are endeavouring to persuade the *Czar*, that for the future, no Holland Merchants may be suffered to pass further into the Country then *Archangel*, no *Persians* beyond *Astraban*, nor any of the *Greeks*, further then *Pontimla*.

Eisenburg, May 7. The General Governor of this Province being lately advised by the *Swedes* Ambassador Count *Donna* from the *Hague*, that upon discourse *de Witte* had told him that of all the Swedish ships that were already brought up, or should be found at Sea with any lading of Pitch, Tar, Iron, Copper, Deales or Planks, the goods should be Esteemed, Counterbanded and made prize; he immediately gave orders to their Commissary in the *Sound*, and to all the Ports in his Province, that no ships should go out till farther advice.

The last night arrived here *Queen Christina*, where 200 Guns proclaimed her Welcome, her Reception was with as much honor as this Province was able to give her, all the Gentry belag met together to attend her.

The two French ships are now taking in their provisions, and will soon be ready to set sail, but the *Danes* Fleet is but little advanced.

Vicenna, May 7. The *Ag* sent hither by the *Visier* of *Buda*, has hitherto only produced the Resolution of his Master touching the limits and bounds between the *Hungarians* and the *Turks*, demanding the Restitution of *Zetkesbesids*, *Ezeck*; and some other little places, which *Ragoski* had formerly taken by force from *Solemni*, a Lord of *Transylvania*, who dying in prison, his Son has since turned *Turk*, and 'tis believed has prevailed upon the *Visier* to endeavor their restoration.

At the late great Faire at *Oedenbourg* in *Hungary*, there happened a Fire in one of the Merchants shops, which in a very little time burnt down a great number of its Neighbouring ones, the Merchants not having time to save any thing but their Moneys, their loss computed to amount to above 100000 Florins.

The third instant the Archbishop of *Graan*, with Count *Nadassi* and several other Lords of the Kingdom of *Hungary*, were to have had an Audience from the Emperor, but tail-

ing to come in the time, in which his Imperial Majesty expected them, they have not yet been able to obtain another Audience, though they have laboured much to excuse themselves: The said Count *Nadassi* is by the Emperor joyned in Commission with the Archbishop to supply the charge of the Palatinate of *Hungary* till the next Diet.

Rome, May 7. The Pope still continues in a weak and dying condition, and the factions busily employed to improve their Interests against the Conclave, which will be kept in the Quirinale. Yesterday the New Venetian Cardinal *Delfino* made his publick entry, having been received at *Ponte Mole* by Monsignor *Bonvisi* in Cardinal *Chigi's* Coach, attended by those of the Popes Family, with the Coaches of the Cardinals, Ambassadors and Princes to the number of 70, all of them of six horses, who conducted him to the Cardinal Nephews Lodging at *Monte Cavallo*, where he made him his Complements and left him.

On Thursday last the Cardinals *Vendosme* and *de Berry* arrived with three French Gallies at *Civita Vecchia*, the first of them being to morrow to make likewise his publick Entry; but as yet there is no talk of a Consistory to give them their Hats.

Venice, May 13. Our latest Letters from the *Levant* inform us, That the Grand Visier had plained the Countrey 15 Miles together, about the Port of *Suda*, cutting down the Trees and Vines, and driving away all their Cattel, that the Garison might have no Supplies out of those parts; and that 'tis believed the Visier has some Design to attempt that place, as also *Spina longa*, having commanded a considerable Body of his Army to march that way, and ordered several of his ships to lye at the Mouth of their Haven.

The Fleet from *Constantinople* are in great readiness, and will speedily put to Sea, consisting of 60. Gallies, and several Galeasses, with great numbers of Men aboard them, which they intend to put ashore in *Candia*. They expect likewise a considerable Succor from *Barbary*. Our people are not idle for their Defence, having compleated several Works about the Town of *Candia*, which will much contribute to the strength of it. Captain Gen. *Morosini* has sent into the City a large supply of Provisions and Moneys, in several ships commanded by Seignior *Gio: Morosini*.

Letters from *Albania* inform us, That great care is taken for the Reparation of those Ruines, occasioned by the late terrible Earthquake; they begin again to build at *Ragusa*, and are calling home all their Nobility, and other people that are Subjects, and abroad in Foreign parts, and are consulting about the most effectual means of re-Peopling the City. They have chosen a New Duke, but an old Man, whom they have instated in the Dignity for his life; whereas formerly the power of their Dukes lasted no longer then a Month, and assigned him a Revenue in Lands of 500 Ducats a year, towards the supporting of his State.

On Tuesday last Captain Gen. *Andrea Cornaro*, having made his Quarantine came into this City, with a great Train of the Nobility, and his own Relations and Friends, and the next day was received with much honor at the Colledge.

On wednesday his Electoral Highness of *Bavaria* with his Princess and a Trayne of 270 persons came to *Padua*, and are lodged in the Palace *dell' Arena*, which is richly furnished to receive them.

Paris, May 20. His Majesty hath sent to all the Princes his Allies and to all Courts Sovereign, his Manifesto concerning his pretensions, to *Brabant*, *Hainault*, &c.
