The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

TA, HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentysirft of December last, to prohibit, until the Thirtyfirst Day of March then enfuing, the Exportation of the several Articles of Provision mentioned in the faid Order; and also to permit, for and during the like Term, the Importation, Duty free, of the feveral Articles of Provision also specified in the faid Order, which expired on the Thirty-first of March laft; And whereas it is judged expedient that the Permifiion to import certain Acticles of Provision free of Luty thould be revived, and be in Force for fome Time longer, His Majeây, in virtue of the Powers vefted in His Majefty by an Act paifed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An * Act to continue feveral Laws relating to the " fufpending the Operation of Two Acts of the "Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign 4 of His prefent Majefty for reftraining the Ne-

gociation of Promisfory Notes and Bills of Ex. " change, under a limited Sum, in England; and " to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and " permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, " of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of " other Articles of Provision, without Payment of " Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March " One thousand eight hundred and five; and to " the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and " from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after " the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months from the Date of this Order, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and alfo Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether falted or otherwife ; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Perlons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majelty, and navigated in any Manuer whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforefaid, that shall be to imported, with the proper Officers of the Culloms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above-recited Act .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Cemmiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
