FIRIAS His Mojelly was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentyfirst of December last to probability until the Thirty-first Day of March then emiring, the Exportation of the several Articles of Provision mentioned in the faid Order; and also to permit, for and during the like Term, the Importation, Duty free, of the feveral Articles of Provision also specified in the faid Order, which expired on the Thirty-link of March last; And whereas it is indged expedient that the Permission to import certain Articles of Provision free of Auty should be revived, and be in Torce for some Time longer, His Majesty, in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an AC passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the ss Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign

" of His present Majesty for restraining the Ne-" gociation of Promissory Notes and Birls of Ex-"change, under a limited Sum, in England; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Edizain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March. "One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after "the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months from the Date of this Order, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulle; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether falted or otherwife; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fewls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and may have the state of the state o gated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry hall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that faall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above-recited Act. - And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majethy's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly W. A LL Officers on the Half Pay of the Land
Forces, whether refident in Great Britain, Ireland, or the adjacent Islands, are hereby required immediately to transmit to the Secretary at War, an Account, in Writing, of their Age, past Services, Rank, and present Place of Abode; and such as think themselves, from Age or Infirmities, unfit for further Service, even in this Country, are to accompany their Reports with sufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Causes thereof.

The Officers on Half Pay who are serving in the

Militia, Fencibles, or Volunteers, are to specify the Commission, which they respectively hold, and those otherwise employed under Government, the Nature of the public Situation, which they possess.

Every fuch Officer who shall neglect to make his Report within one Month from the Date hereof, will be considered as otherwise provided for, or dead, and his Name will be struck off the Half Pay List accordingly.
