P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-first of December last, to prohibit, until the Thirty-first Day of March then ensuing, the Exportation of the several Articles of Provision mentioned in the said Order; and also to permit, for and during the like Term, the Importation, Duty free, of the several Articles of Provision also specified in the said Order, which expired on the Thirty-first of March last; And whereas it is judged expedient that the Permission to import certain Articles of Provision free of Duty should be revived, and be in Force for some Time longer, His Majesty, in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign

of His present Majesty for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange, under a limited Sum, in England; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months from the Date of this Order, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwise; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided, that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said aforesaid Act.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

TO OFFICERS ON HALF PAY.

War-Office, May 10, 1804.

ALL Officers on the Half Pay of the Land Forces, whether resident in Great Britain, Ireland, or the adjacent Islands, are hereby required immediately to transmit to the Secretary at War, an Account, in Writing, of their Age, past Services, Rank, and present Place of Abode; and such as think themselves, from Age or Infirmities, unfit for further Service, even in this Country, are to accompany their Reports with sufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Causes thereof.

The Officers on Half Pay who are serving in the Militia, Fencibles, or Volunteers, are to specify the Commission, which they respectively hold, and those otherwise employed under Government, the Nature of the public Situation, which they possess.

Every such Officer who shall neglect to make his Report within one Month from the Date hereof, will be considered as otherwise provided for, or dead, and his Name will be struck off the Half Pay List accordingly.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented to the King, that, on the 17th of March last, between the Hours of Eight and Nine o'Clock in the Evening, at Benjamin Skene, an Officer employed under Captain Birchall, on the Service of raising Men for the Fleet at the City of Chester, was conducting, in a peaceable Manner, one Edward Jones, whom he had impressed, along Bridge-Street, in the said City, assisted by George Marshall (one of the Men employed under Captain Birchall on the above-mentioned Service), who was walking behind him, a Stone was thrown by some Person unknown, which struck the said George Marshall on the Left Side of his Head, and fractured his Skull, and that he died in consequence thereof on the 30th Day of April last;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in this atrocious Act, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the Offenders (except the Person who actually threw the said Stone) who shall discover his or their Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

and having left Chester on the Night the Blow was given, and not having been since heard of, strong Suspicions are entertained that he was the Person who threw the said Stone.
