ORDER OF THE BATH.

GEORGE R.

CEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God of Uthe United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, &c and Sovereign of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas, by the Statute of Our faid Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, it is provided, that We, the Sovereign thereof, have the Power of adding to the same from Time to Time, and of explaining any Particular therein, as to Us shall seem expedient, all which Additions and Explanations, under Our Sign Manual, are to be taken as Part and Parcel of the Statutes of our faid Order: And whereas, in and by the Eighteenth Statute, it is (amongst other Things) declared to be the Duty of the Genealogist of the faid Order to examine and enter the Pedigrees of the refpective Perfons then already elected, and of fuch as might hereafter be elected into the faid Order, and of their Efquires, Governors, and of the Young Esquires, with their, several Coat Arms; and that he was likewife fairly to enter the fame into Books, to remain to Pollevity for the Memorial of their Families : And whereas certain Differences, have ariten between Our Servants the King's Heralds and Pursuivants of Our College of Aims, and the Genealogist of the faid Most Honorable, Order, refpecting the Exercise of the Daties, which by the faid Eighteenth Statute are affigued to Our faid Genealogist, for the Adjustment of which a Chap ter of the faid Molt, Honorable Military Order was held on the 10th Day of June last: And whereas it was by the faid Chapter refolved, That as it appeared to the Chapter to be the Opinion of the Law Offi ers of the Crown, that the Heralds, (that is' to fay, Our Servants the King's Heralds and Purfuivauts of Our College of Arms,) have the Original Cognizance of Pedigrees and Coat Armour, and that the Genealogilt cannot properly receive any Evidence of Pedigree or Coat-Armour to Be entered in his Books in pursuance of the Statutes, except from the College of Arme, The Chapter therefore humbly recommended to Us, that We would be pleased to command, that the Pedigrees and Arns of the Knights and Elquires of this Order should be'recorded in the College of Arms, upon Payment. of the accustomed Fees, and that Copies of such Pedigrees and Arms be communicated to the Geo nealogilt of the Order, who shall enter the same in Books of the Order to be provided for that Purpole; and that We would alle be gracioully pleafed to determine such Fees as the Jaid Genealogist should be entitled to for making such Transcripts in those Books; And whereas at a Chapter of Our College of Arms, held at Our faid College on the Twenty-third Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four, it was ordered, That the Treafurer of Our faid College should provide, at the Office Expence, a Book to be uled only for the Entry of the Pedigrees and Arms of the Knights Companions of the Molt Honorable, Order of the Bath, and another for those of their respective

Equires; and that of every Entry fo to be made, and for which the accustomed Fees shall have been paid to the College, the Regist r shall, upon the Application of the Genealogist of the faid Order for the Time being, deliver, or caufe to be delivered, to the faid Genealogift a Copy to be entered in the Books of the faid Order, according to the Statutes of the faid Order, and for which Co y no Fees shall be charged or taken by the Register, or any other Officer of the College : Now We, having duly confidered fuch Recommendation and fuch Older of Our College of Arms, do hereby command and enjoin all the Knights who have been invested with this Most Honorable Military Order since the Fif teenth Day of June One thouland feven hundred and ninety two, (being the Date of the Patent of the present Genealogist,) and their Esquires, Governors, and Young Elquires, that they shall record their respective Pedigrees and Coat-Arms in the College of Arms, paying therefor the accultom d Fees; and that the laid Genealogist, or the Gepealogist for the Time being, shall procure a Copy of the fame from the Register of Our faid College of Arms, and examine and transcribe the same in the Genealogical Books of the faid Order: And We do hereby further command and enjoin, That each and every of the faid Krights, their Elquires, Governors, and their Young Esquires, shall pay to the afgresaid Genealog'st, or to the Genealogist for the Time being, for the examining and entering of fuch Pédigrees and Coat rms in the Genealog cal Books of the faid Order in Manner following, to wit-For the first D scent or Generation the S m of Six Shillings and Fight Pencer and for every additional Defcent or Generation the Sum of Five Shillings, and for entering the Armorial Entigns of a Knight Companion the Sum of One Pound Ten Shillings (all which Fees have been the usual Feer paid by Us out of Our Treasury in Cales where We have been graciously pleased to defeharge the Expences incurized by the Investiture of any Knight Elect,) and for 'entering the Armorial Enfigns of an Liquite Fifteen Shillings, the aforefaid Sums being conformable to a Table of Fres, dated the Seventeenth Day of March One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, iffued under the Hand of Qur dear entirely belowed Son Frederick acting as Great Master, and under the Seal of the faid Order, which faid Table We do, by these Pres tents, confirm and ratify; and each and every of fuch Knights, Elquires, Governors, and Young Elquires, shall also pay to the Officer who may be employed to record their faid Pedigrees and Coat Arms in the College of Arms, the accuf. tomed Fee for so doing : And We do hereby direct all the faid Kn ghts, E quire, Governors, and Young Esquires, to certify their Belief of the I ruth and Correctnels of their respective Pedigrees in the Genealogical Books of the faid Order; Atd Wa. do hereby further ordain, I hat nothing herein constained shall prejudife or injure the Rights and Privileges of our faid Geneak gift, as given and fecured to him by the aforefaid Statutes, which we jin all Respects, hereby confirm. Given under Our Sign Manual the Eighth Day of May One thouland eight hundred and four, in the Forty-fourth Year of our Reign C. YORKE.
