T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 14th of May 1804,

· · · PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the Twenty-third Ul-timo, to direct that all Ships or Veffels which thould be bound to the Port of Greenock, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, should perform their Quarantine in Holy Loch, in the Firsh of Clyde, in place of Lamlash, in the Island of Arran; and that all Goods on board such Ships should be aired at the fame Place; His Majefty is hereby pleafed to order, that Holy Loch, in the Firth of Clyde, inftead of Lamlafh, in the Island of Arran, shall also be the Place for the Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Veffels which shall be bound to any of the Weftern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glasgow, Greenock, Irwine, Camp-beltown, Oban, Rothelay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed ; and that all Goods imported on board fuch Ships shall be aired at the same Place :- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively ap-pertain. Copy of a Letter from Rear Admiral Sir John Thomas Duckworth, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels at Jamaica, to William Marfden, Efg; dated Port Royal, March 24, 1804. SIR.

OU will herewith receive, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter from Captain Rofs, of His Majefty's Ship Pique, stating the Capture of the French National Cutter Terreur, on the 18th Instant, which arrived at this Port last Evening.

HAVE the Honor to inform you, that, after a Chace of Five Hours, this Day, we came up L a Chace of Five Flours, this Day, we came up with and captured the French National Cutter La Terreur of Ten Guns, (Six of which they threw overboard in the Chace,) and Screnty-five Men, commanded by Monf. Collinet, Lieutenant de Vaif-feau, from Santo Domingo Two Days, and had taken nothing.

Copy of another Letter from Rear-Admiral Sir John Thomas Duckworth, K. B. Ec. to William Marf. den, Efg; dated at Jamaica the 7th April 1804. SIR,

I TRANSMIT you herewith a Letter from Cap-tain Le Geyts, of His Majelty's Ship Stork, ftating the Capture of a Felucca Privateer; there are allo Two other Privateers captured fince our last, according to the accompanying Lift, which I beg you to lay before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty. His Majefly's Sloop Stork, off Cape Nicola SIR. Mole, 30th March 1804.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that His Majelty's Sloop under my Command has this Day captured, after a Chafe of Six Hours, the French Felucca Privateer L'Hirondelle, of Three Guns (Two of which were thrown overboard in the Chafe) and Forty-four Men. She has been Three Months from Guadaloupe, but last from Banacoa, and had taken nothing.
