NOTICE TO MARINERS SAILING TO
THE BALTIC.

THAT, from the 1st of May next ensuing, the
Pfundude near Pillau, in which the old Pillau
Light has hitherto been burning, and which also
served Navigators to know the Land, will be pulled
down, and the Hill upon which this Building stood,



cut down, and levelled to a certain Height. But, in order to indemnify Mariners with respect to the Loss of this Land-Mark, a substantial Light-House shall be built on a high Hill situated N. N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. distant about one-eighth of a League from the Pfandbude.

But as this Light-House cannot be erected till the 1st of May next, therefore a temporary Light-House will be previously built on the same Hill, and in the same Place, where the future Light-House is to stand, painted White, and the former Light put to it; and near it there will also be erected a high Beacon, painted Black, in order to know the Land better.

Ships coming from Sea which draw too much Water, and therefore cannot run into the Channel of Pillau, must, in order to come to Anchor in the right Road off the Entrance, bring the following Land-Marks to bear by the Compass:

- (1) The temporary White-painted Light-House and the Black Beacon, East;
- (2) The City and Harbour of Pillau South East, East; and
- (3) The Castle Lochstaedt, on the North Side of the Wood, for the most Part close to the same, East North East,

in Ten or Eleven Fathom Water at this Distance, and in stormy Weather at a greater Distance from the Shore; they will also meet the Pilots at Sea, with a Boat like unto a Liverpool Pilot Boat, either lying at Anchor in the right Road, or under Sail, with a Red Flag flying at the Mast-Head.
