THEREAS, in pursuance of the Powers vested V in His Majesty by an A& passed in the Forty-second Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An A& for enabling His Majesty to permit the Im-portation and Exportation of certain Goods and "Commodities into and from the Port of RoadHarbour, in the Island of Tortola, until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and three, and from thence until Six Weeks after the " Commencement of the then next Sellion of Parlia-" ment;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixteenth of August One thouland eight hundred and two, to permit, and did thereby permit, during the Time limited by the faid Act, the Importation into the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, one of the Virgin Islands, from Countries and Plantations in America and the West Indies belonging to, or under the Dominion of any Foreign European Sovereign or State, of all such Articles, Goods, and Commodities enumerated in certain Acts, passed in the Twenty-seventh, Thirty-second, and Thirty-third Years of His Majesty's Reign, as are permitted by the said Acts to be imported into the Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, one of the Bahama Islands; and also the Exportation thereof from the said Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola aforesaid, in the same Manner, and subject to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof, as are provided in the faid. Acts, or any of them, respecting such Importation into the said Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom, and subject also to the Conditions, Rules, and Regulations thereinaftermentioned; that is to say, That before any Sugar or Coffee, the Produce of Tortola and its Dependencies, shall be permitted or suffered to be shipped or laden on board any Ship or Vessel, each and every Package shall be stamped or marked by the proper Officer of the Customs in Roman Letters of

That all Sugar and Coffee not being the Produce of any of the British Plantations, Islands, or Territories, shall, upon Importation into Road-Harbour, be laid on Land and examined, and shall be deposited in safe and secure Warehouses, under the Joint Locks of His Majesty and the Owner or Proprietor of such Sugar and Cossee, and the same shall not be afterwards shipped or laden on board any Ship or Vessel, unless directly from such Warehouses, (upon due Entry thereof being first made,) under the Care and Inspection of the proper Officer of the Customs; and before any such Sugar or Cosee shall be permitted or suffered to be shipped or fee shall be permitted or suffered to be shipped or laden on board any Ship or Vessel, each and every Package shall be stamped or marked by the proper Officer of the Customs in Roman Letters of not less than Two Inches in Length, with the Word FOREIGN, and shall also be numbered progressively; and whereas the said above recited Act, passed in the Forty-second Year of His Majesty's Reign, has been by another Act, passed in the last Seign, has been by another Act, paned in the last Seign of Parliament, continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit, and doth by this His Order in Council permit, until further Order, the Importation into the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, one of the Virgin Islands, from Countries and Plantations in America and the Welt Indies, belonging to or under the Dominion of any Foreign European Sovereign or State, of all such Articles, Goods, and Commodities as were by His Majesty's said Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and two, permitted to be so imported into the said Port of Road-Harbour, and also the Exportation thereof from the said Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forseitures for the Breach thereof, as were expressed and contained in His Majesty's said Order in Council bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and two:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury

and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-first Day of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this Order, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fussering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inslicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden the Cinque Ports, the Malter-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respec-W.
