## PR「ESENT，

 The KING＇s Molt Excellent Majelty in Council． THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty＇s Order in Council of the Fourth Day of Ja－ nuary laft，prohibiting the tranfporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig－Iron，Bar－Iron， Hemp，Pitch，Tar，Rofin，Turpentine，Anchors， Cables，Cordage，Mafts，Yards，Bowfprits，Oars， Oakum，Oker，Sheet－Copper，or other Naval Stores，＂will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next：And whereas it is j：dged expedient for His Majelty＇s Service，and the Safety of this Kingdom，that the faid Prohibition fhould be con－ tinued for fome Tinse longer，His Majefty doth therefore，with the Advice of His Privy Council， hereby order，require，prohibit，and command，that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time， for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eleventh Day of July next，prefume to tranfort －into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig－lron， Bar－Iron，Hemp，Pitch，Tar，Rofin，Turpentine， Anc̀hors，Cables，Cordage，Mafts，Yards，Bowiprits， Oars，Oakam，Oker，Sheet－Copper，or other Naval Stores，or do fhip or lade any Pig－Iron，Bar－Iron， Hemp，Pitch，「ar，Rofin，Turpentine，Anchors， sCables，Cordage，Mafts，Yards；Bowfprits，Oarc， ©Okum，Oker，Sheet－Copper，or other Nival Stores，or Slis or lade any of the Articles above－ mentioned on boand any Ship or Veffel，in order to tranfporting the fame to any Parts beyond the Seas， without Leave or Permiffion firft＇being had and ob－ ．tained from His Majefly or His Privy Council，upon iPain of incurring the Forfeitures indicted by an Act ：paffed in the Thirty－thicd Year of His Majefty＇s ；Reign，intituled＂An Act to enable His Majeity ．＂to reftrain the Exportation of Naval Siores，and $\because$ more effectually to prevent the Exportation of © Salt－Petre，Arms，and A mpmnision，when p：o－．＂hibited by Proclamation or Order in Council：＂ But it is neverthelefs His Majefty＇s Pleafure，that nothing herein contained fhall extend，or be con－＊ frued to extend，to any of His Majefty＇s Ships of War，or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majelty，or employed or freighted by His Majelty＇s Board of Ordnance，or by the Cum－ miffioners of His Majefty＇s Navy；nor to prèvent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be nece［－ fary for the Ule of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage，or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain，or the Commiffioners＇of the Admiralty for the Time being；nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland，of to His Majefty＇s Yards or Garrifons，or to His Majefty＇s Colonies or Planta． tions in America or the Weft Indies，or to New－ foundland，or to His Majefty＇s Forts and Settle－ ments on the Coaft of Africa，or to the Ifland of St．Helena，or to the Britifh Settlements or Factories in the Eaft Indies：Provided，that upon the Ex－ portation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur－ pofes of Trade to Ireiand，or to His Majelty＇s Yards and Garififons，or to His Majefty＇s Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies，or to the Inand of Newfoundland，or to His Ma－ jefty＇s Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa， or to the LAland of St．Helena，or to the Britifh Settlements or Factories in－the Ealt Indies，the Exporters of fuch Axticles do firft make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they fhall be entered oatwards，before the Entry of the fame frall be made，and do give full and fufficient Security，by Bond，to the Satisfaction of the Commifioners of His Majefty＇s Cuftoms，to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards，and for the Purpofes fpecified，and none other；and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiflioners，by
