THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to continue, until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and five, an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, for continuing Two Acts, the one passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty, for regulating the Prices at which Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and the other, made in the last Session of Parliament, for permitting the Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt into Great Britain from Ireland.

An Act for assessing the Proprietors of Lands in the County of Inverness towards the Expence of making and supporting such Roads and Bridges therein as shall be approved of by the Commissioners appointed by an Act of the last Session of Parliament, for making Roads and building Bridges in the Islands of Scotland.

An Act for amending and repairing several Roads leading from the Guildhall and Market-House in Tavistock to New Bridge, to Greston Bridge, to Downton-Gate, to Riccard's-House, to Cherrybrook and Dunnabridge-Pound, and to Morwellham and New Quay, all in the County of Devon.
