Genoua, Nov. 27.

Wo days fince arrived here the Loretto laden with Sugars and Tobacco from Lisbon, and in her an Envoy feat by the Prince of Portugal to the Duke of Savoy; to adjust as is said fome matters relating to the Marriage between his Highnels and the Infanta of Portugal. Vienna, Nov. 28. On Sunday last arrived here the Duke of Lorraine; and the same day his Wife, the Queen of Poland was brought to bed of a Son who was the next day christened by the Popes Nuncio. Lintz. Decemb 3. The Emperour has ratified the Agreement made by General Caprara with the Hungarian-Malecont nes for a Cessation of Arm. And there is a discourse that an Express is arrived who brings a Treaty of Peace concluded between the fa d General and them. Yellerday arrived here the Dake of Neuburg, and was received at the water fide by the Emperor; It is faid his Highness will ffay here most part of the winter, and that the Durchess of Neuburg will be likwise here against the time of the Empresses lying in. Count Taft is gone from hence, being fent, as we have already informed you to the Electors and other Princes of the Rhine.

Berlin, Decemb. 3. The last week dyed here the Sieur Blaspiel, who was one of our Electors Ambaffadors at the Treaty at Nimeguen. Lieutenant General Spaen who is Governor of Cleves, has orders to repair immediately to his Government, and will accordingly begin his journey to morrow or the day following. The Plague was in a Houle in the City of Magdeburg, but orders were given for the shuting it up so soon that the insection has not yet spread it self any farther, and its hoped it will ftop there, the weather being of a findain grown extream cold, notwithflanding which the Plague rages still at Leipzicke, and in thost pla es of Saxony; and for that reason the Court continues at Bautzen: Many people here pretend to have f en a Comet, which they are much troubled at.
