HIS Day the Lords being met, a Mellage was fent to the Honorable Houle of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, au-shorifed by virtue of His Majefly's Commiffion for de-claring His Royal Affent to feveral Alls agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers to hear the Com-miffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion empowering the Lord Ach the faid Commission, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to "the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Allent given to

An AA to repeal the feveral Duties under the Commiffioners for managing the Duties upon stamp-ed Vellum, Parchment, and Paper in Great Britain, and to grant new and additional Duties in lieu thereof.

An A& for raifing the Sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds Irish Currency, by Treasury-Bills, for the Service of Ireland for the Year One thousand eight hundred and four.

An Act for granting additional Annuities to the Proprietors of Stock created by Two Acts paffed in the Thirty-feventh and Forty-fecond Years of His prefent Majefty.

An AA for making further Regulations for the better Collection and Security of His Majefty's Revenue of Cuftoms and Excile in Ireland, and for preventing Frauds therein.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty ninth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and five, feveral Acts for the better Collection and Security of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, and for preventing Frauds therein.

An Act to permit, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five, the warehousing of Spirits in Ireland for Exportation, for charging a Duty on the fame when taken out r for Home Confumption, and to regulate the Ex-portation to Great Britain of fuch Spirits as shall not be warehoused

An Act for appointing, until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and five, Commillioners to enquire into the Fees, Gratuities, Per. I of certain Docks made under an Act, paffed in the

quifites, and Emoluments which are or have been lately received in the feveral Public Offices in Ireland therein mentioned; to examine into any Abules which may exilt in the fame, and into the prefent. Mode of receiving, collecting, iffuing, and account-

An Act to amend certain of the Provisions of an Act, made in the Forty-third Year of His prefent Majefty, to enable His Majefty to provide for the Defence and Security of the Realm, which refpect the Purchafe of Lands and Hereditaments for the public Service:

An AA to alter, amend, and render more effec. tual an Act, passed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled An Act for establishing and maintaining a permanent Additional Force for the De-fence of the Realm, and to provide for augmenting His Majefty's Regular Forces, and for the gradual Reduction of the Militia of England, fo far as the fame relates to the City of London.

An Act to explain an Act of the prefent Selfion of Parliament for confolidating and amending the Provisions of the feveral Acts relating to Corps of Yeomanry and Volunteers in Great Britain, fo far as refpects the accounting for Monies received by-Volunteer Officers.

An Act for the more effectual Administration of Juffice in those Parts of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called England and Ireland, by the issuing of Write of Habeas Corpus ad Teftificandum in certain Cafes.

An Act for permitting, until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and seven, the Exportation of Salt from the Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, the Port of Exuma, and the Port of Crooked Ifland, in the Bahama Iflands, in Ships belonging to the Inhabitants of the United States of America, and coming in Ballast.

An Act for making Compensation to the Pro-prietors of certain Lands and Hereditaments fituate at Woolwich and Charlton, in the County of Kent, purchased in pursuance of Three several Acts of Parliament, made in the Forty-fecond and Forty-third Years of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, for promoting the Service of His Majefty's Ordnance.

An AA for warehousing Goods within the Limits
