

Conduct, shall immediately repair to the Places specified in the annexed List, as the Head-Quarters of the 2d Battalions of their respective Regiments, reporting their Arrival (if the Quarter is in England) to the Inspector-General of the Recruiting Service in London, under Cover to the Secretary at War; or if in Ireland or North Britain, to the Deputy Inspectors-General in Dublin or Edinburgh respectively, from whom they will receive Instructions for their future Guidance.

Officers appointed to Regiments, the Head-Quarters of which are in Great Britain, will draw their Pay from the Regimental Agents in London; those appointed to Regiments in Ireland, from the Regimental Agents in Dublin.
