A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament flands prorogued W to Thursday the Fourth Day of October next, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the faid Par-liament shall be further prorogued on the faid Fourth Day of October next, to Tuesday the Twenty-feventh Day of November next : And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the fame accordingly; and We do further, hereby, with the Advice afore-faid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure. That the faid Parliament, fhall, on the faid Twenty-feventh Day of November next, be held, and fit for the Difpatch of divers urgent and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Com-miffioners for Shires and Burgefs of the Houfe of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly, at Weltminster, on the faid Twenty-feventh Day of November next.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.,

WHEREAS George Hay, Marquis of Twee-dale, was duly clefted and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is fince deceased: In order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to fit in his Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue forth this Pro-clamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to allemble and meet at Holysood-House, in Edinburgh, on Wednesday the

Fourteenth Day of November next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choofe another Peer of Scotland, to fit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the Room of the faid George Hay, Marquis of Tweedale, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that fhall then be prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as fhall be abfent, (fuch Proxies being Peers, and pro-ducing a Mandate in Writing, duly figned before Witneffes, and both Confituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law,) and the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Seffion, as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to at-tend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes, and immediately after fuch Election made and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer fo elected, and fign and attelt the fame in the Prefence of the faid Peers the Electors, and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain : And We ftrictly charge and command that this Proclamation be duly pub-lifted at the Market Crofs at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns in Scotland, Twenty-five Days at leaft, before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed on fuch Election.
