ville late Ambaliador from the Crown of Poland to the Emperor and the Pope, to which we may now add, that the taid Prince and Princels are fuddainly exp field at Berlin in order to their Marriage, which is now lookt upon as concluded. The Eleftor of Saxony raifes men, and intends to have a very confiderable Army on foot, to be employed as his Electoral Highnel's declares, for the defence of the Empire whenever there thall be occafion. The Elector of Brandenburg likewife raifes men, but they are not to be formed into any new Troops, but to receive thole that are already on foot. The Prince of Hanover is gore for Holland, and from thence will pais over for England.

Cologne, Decemb. 17, Our Magistrates have recrived a Letter from the Emperor, wherein he t lls them that underflanding that they were like to fall into great diforders on account of fome of the old Burg rmafters who are acculed of mifemploying the publick money, and of other mildemeanors, he had thought fit to take cognizance thereof, and to order the Count d' Oringen to repair hither, to examine the matter, and to make a report thereof to his Imperial Majefty; commanding them in th me n time to ftop all proceedings against the fuid Burgermasters. But our Magistrates have hereupon written to the faid Count of Ottingen, who is at prefent at the Court of the Duke of Juliers, to pray him not to give himfelf the trouble to come hither; for that they will themfelves give the Emperor an account of what has been done here with relation to the faid profecution; and do not doubt but his Imperial Majeffy will remain fatisfied therewith The Sieur Kopping one of the Burgermalters that fled, co-finues under the Duke of Juhers protection, which this City cannot obtain of his high-Bels to withdraw from him.

Hague, Decemb. 20. The States of Holland are going to feparate; It'is believed they will at prefent onely confent provisionally to the State of the War for the next year, thinking it convenient to defer their politive refolution upon it, till their next meeting, which will be in February. Yefterday atrived here the Prince of Hanover who is lo.lged in the old Hoff, and this morning the Prince of Orarge gave him a visit; Its belived his flay here will be but flort, a Yacht which is to carry his Highnels for England, attending him in the Maeze.

Bruffells, Decemb. 20. To morrow we expect -the Count d' Archinto and Don Bernardo de Salinas from Antwerp, having as we told you in our laft fettled in great measure the affairs they were fent thicher about. Here is arrived an Extraordinary Courier from Spain, and though we do not yet certainly know what he brings, yet the general difcough is, that orders are come for the puting in execution the great reform, which has been fo much spoken of, as well with relation to the Army as to the Civil Government, a thing very much defired by most people, because of the advantage they believe it will be to the Affairs of these Provinces, by the retrenchment that will be made of feveral great expences that may very well be spared, and by applying those moneys towards the maintenance of the Forces, who are now to receive a

months pay, which will be very welcome to them. The Prince of *Parma* is much better fince yefterday, fo that we are in great hopes of his fpeedy recovery; It is faid that fo foon as he is able to travel, he will go for *Antwerp*, and flay a month soft inclusion.

Answerp, Decemb. 20. The Count Archinto and Son Bernardo da Salinas have finally adjusted the rineipal matters, concerning the Impolts, which the very buch moderated in all particulars, and miefly that upon French wine which is brought down from 14 to 6 Gilders per tunn; And in confideration thereof the Magiltrates have appointed the 6th to me.t. and to confider of renewing feveral duties which are expired. Don Bernardo de Sal.nas is gong to Bruffells to give the Prince of Parmagin account of what they have done, and the Count d' Arobnito flays here to be prefent at the allembling of the 26th, who its believed will readily comply with what is defired of them. In the mean time there is no more talk of the Taylor, (a Burgher of this City) that wes feized by order of the Prince of Parma and fent prisoner to Mamur, being acculed of Treason, and particularly charged as is faid with holding forreigne Correfpondencies,

Park, Decemb. 18. The Dauphine recovers his health anore and more to the great joy of that Court; It is faid that in the Spring he will go to Bourbon to take the waters.

Falmouth, Decemb. 13. The 9th inflant put in here Six Folm Berry in the Leopard (having on bord his Grasse the Duke of Grafton, who has been the wholewayage) with feveral Merchants Ships under his Convoy, from the Sneights.
