THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Fourth Day of October next, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Fourth Day of October next, to Tuesday the Twenty-seventh Day of November next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further, hereby, with the Advice afore-faid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That the faid Parliament, shall, on the faid Twenty-seventh Day of November next, be held, and fit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of -Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Twenty seventh Day of November next.

Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel with any of the Articles above mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
