ELECTION OF A TEMPORAL PEER OF IRELAND.

Whitehall, August 18, 1804.

The King has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to confer the Honor of Knighthood upon David Baird and John Stuart, Efquires, Major Generals in the Army, who have received His Majelty's Licence to accept and wear the Infignia of the Ottoman Order of the Crefcent (of the superior Degree), trafimitted to them by the Grand Signor :

And the Order of the Crefcent having been instituted by His Majefty's Ally the Grand Signor, in Commemoration of the fignal and important Services rendered to the Ottoman Empire by the glorious Atchievements of the British Arms in Egypt, the King has further been pleafed, by Warrants under His Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to grant unto the faid Major-Generals Sir David Baird and Sir John Stuart His Royal Licence and Permiffion to bear, in Allufion thereto, a Crefcent, and certain other appropriate honorable Augmentations, toge-ther with Supporters, to their Armorial Enfignes; the fame being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds'-Office :

And also to order, that these His Majesty's feveral Conceffions, and especial Marks of His Royal Favour, be registered in His College of Arms.

The King has been pleafed to grant the Dignity of a Baronet of the United Kingdom of Great Pritain and Ireland unto Sir Robert Ainflie, of Great Torrington, in the County of Lincoln, Knight, late His Majefty's Ambaffador at the Ottoman Porte, and the Heirs Male of his Body lawfully begotten, with Remainder to Robert Sharpe Ainflie, of Market Stainton, in the faid County of Lincoln, Efq; Nephew of the faid Sir Robert Ainflie, and Son of General George Ainflie, deceased, and the Heirs Male of his Body lawfully begotten.

The King has also been pleafed to grant the Dig-nity of a Baronet of the faid United Kingdom to William Burroughs, Efq; late Advocate-General of Bengal, and the Heirs Male of his Body lawfully begotten.

SIR,

700 will herewith receive a Letter from Captain Mudge, of His Majefty's Ship Blanche, which you will please to lay before the Lords Commissioners I am, &c. J. T. DUCKWORTH. of the Admiralty.

Blanche, off Corofoa, North 3 Miles, SIR, 29th June 1804. Ying-too, under the Guns of Saint Cruz, (Corofoa) at Four P. M. I faw an Armed Schooner flauding in from Sea, as foon as fhe was Hull out I made fail, and after a hard Chafe, the Frigate running Eleven Knots under her Royals and Top Gallant Studding Sails, at Nine P. M. captured the Durch Schooner Nimrod, mounting Four Four-Pounders, Copper-bottomed and fattened, and but Two Years old; fhe is the fatteft Veffel I have met with fince I have been in the Weft Indies, and was one of the Two Schooners that engaged the Flying Fifh, having then on board Fifty Men. 
