IT is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament which was to meet on Tuesday the Twenty-seventh Day of this instant November be further prorogued to Thursday the Third Day of January next, then to meet for the Dispatch of Business:—And the Right Honorable the Lord High Chancellor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, is to cause a Commission to be prepared in the usual Manner, for proroguing the Parliament accordingly. *W. WHEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange, under a limited Sum, in England; and the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation into, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-seventh Day of June

last, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, from the Eighth Day of August last, the Importation of sundry Articles of Provisions therein specified Duty free; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Eighth Day of this instant November, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwise; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said above-recited Act.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Viscount Nelson, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to William Marsden, Esq; dated on board the Victory, at Sea, the 14th October 1804.

SIR,

I HEREWITH transmit you a Letter from Captain Pearse, of His Majesty's Sloop Halcyon, dated the 23d of September last, giving an Account of his having captured L'Esperance French Privateer, on the 20th of that Month, which you will be pleased to lay before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty for their Information; and at the same Time acquaint their Lordships, that Captain Pearse's Exertions on the present, and several former Occasions; for the Protection of our Trade, and Destruction of the Enemy's Privateers in the Vicinity of Gibraltar, very justly entitles him to my warmest Approbation.

His Majesty's Sloop Halcyon, off Gibraltar-Bay, September 23, 1804.

I HAVE the Honor to inform your Lordship, that, on the 20th Instant, being on my Way from this Place to Tangier, I discovered several Sail to the Westward, one a Settee boarding a Brig; I made all Sail possible, with a very light Air from the Eastward; and it is with Pleasure I inform your Lordship, after Eight Hours' Chase, incessantly pulling, and Boats towing against a strong Current, we got within Gun-shot. After exchanging our Bow, and the her Stern Chasers, (now and then a Broad-side,) she struck her Colours, and proved to be L'Esperance French Privateer of Nice, Captain Joseph Lebouis, pierced for Twelve Guns, but only Ten mounted, of different Calibres, from Twenty-fours to Twelves; had on board Fifty-four Men, but, owing to its being quite dark, Twenty-two made their escape in Boats before we took Possession. I am happy to say we had not any one hurt. Our Rigging and Sails sustained a little Damage. L'Esperance had Two wounded, and several Shot in her Hull, Masts, and Yards. I beg Leave to mention to your Lordship she is the same Privateer that captured the Swift Cutter, Fortitude Merchant Brig, and Three Letters of Marque belonging to Gibraltar; she is the largest and best equipped of the Kind I have yet seen. My Officers and Ship's Company on this, as well as on similar Occasions, acted with that Zeal and Perseverance that deserves my warmest Praise.
