Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwise; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet.Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Came, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amitty with His fons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforelaid, that shall be so imported, with the-proper. W Hereas it is highly effential, for the Prefervation of the Health of His Majesty's Subjects, that the several Regulations, respecting the Personance of Qua-rantine, although at all Times to be most strictly ensorced, should, under the present Circumstances, be especially at-tended to, and the Violation thereof punished with the utmost Severity.

Notice is hereby given, that any Person coming in, or going on board any Ship or Vessel liable to the Personance of Quarantine, who shall presume to land in any Port or Place of the United Kingdom, or who shall quit such Ship, or Vessel, or Boat before he shall be regularly discharged from Quarantine, by Order of His Majesy's Most Honorable Privy Gouncil; and any Person supposed to a state of the control of the state Person who shall wilfully resuse or neglect to repair to the Lazaret, or other Place duly appointed for the Personmance of Quarantine, or shall escape, or attempt to escape therefrom before Quarantine shall be auly performed, will thereby become subject to divers Penalties, Forfeitures, and Imprisonments according to the Nature of the Offence, under and by virtue of an Ast made and paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesly, for the Persormance of Quargnto suffer Death as in Cases of Felony, without Benefit of Clergy.

And Notice is hereby further given, That all Pilots Fishermen, Boatmen, and all other Persons who shall be in any Manner aiding, affiling, or concerned in bringing on Shore, or conveying from Juch Ship or Vessel. Itable to Quarantine, on board any other Ship, or Vessel. or Boat, any Persons coming in or going on board any Ship or Vessel, or bringing on Shore any Letters, Packets, or Parcels from any fuch Ship or Vessel liable to the Performance of Quarantine, will in like Manner be subject to certain heavy Penalties and Punishments.
