IT is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament which was to meet on Tuesday the Twenty-seventh Day of this instant November be further prorogued to Thursday the Third Day of January next; then to meet for the Dispatch of Business:—And the Right Honorable the Lord High Chancellor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, is to cause a Commission to be prepared in the usual Manner, for proroguing the Parliament accordingly. *W. P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange, under a limited Sum, in England; and the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation into, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-seventh Day of June last, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, from the Eighth Day of August last, the Importation of sundry Articles of Provisions therein specified Duty free; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said Permission should be continued for some

Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow; and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Eighth Day of this instant November, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwise; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said above-recited Act.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. *W. Q U A R A N T I N E.

Custom-House, London, November 9, 1804.

Whereas it is highly essential, for the Preservation of the Health of His Majesty's Subjects, that the several Regulations, respecting the Performance of Quarantine, although at all Times to be most strictly enforced, should, under the present Circumstances, be especially attended to, and the Violation thereof punished with the utmost Severity.

Notice is hereby given, that any Person coming in, or going on board any Ship or Vessel liable to the Performance of Quarantine, who shall presume to land in any Port or Place of the United Kingdom, or who shall quit such Ship, or Vessel, or Boat before he shall be regularly discharged from Quarantine, by Order of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; and any Person who shall wilfully refuse or neglect to repair to the Lazaret, or other Place duly appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, or shall escape, or attempt to escape therefrom before Quarantine shall be duly performed, will thereby become subject to divers Penalties, Forfeitures, and Imprisonments according to the Nature of the Offence, under and by virtue of an Act made and passed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, for the Performance of Quarantine, and in certain Cases be liable, under the said Act, to suffer Death as in Cases of Felony, without Benefit of Clergy.

And Notice is hereby further given, That all Pilots, Fishermen, Boatmen, and all other Persons who shall be in any Manner aiding, assisting, or concerned in bringing on Shore, or conveying from such Ship or Vessel liable to Quarantine, on board any other Ship, or Vessel, or Boat, any Persons coming in or going on board any Ship or Vessel, or bringing on Shore any Letters, Packets, or Parcels from any such Ship or Vessel liable to the Performance of Quarantine, will in like Manner be subject to certain heavy Penalties and Punishments for the said Offences.

And all Persons who shall be guilty of any of the Offences hereinbefore mentioned, will be prosecuted for the same with the utmost Rigour and Severity of the Law.
