QUARANTINE. Custom-House, London, November 9, 1804. W Hereas it is highly effential, for the Prefervation of the Health of His Majesty's Subjects, that the feveral Regulations, respecting the Persormance of Quarantine, although at all Times to be most strictly ensorced, should, under the present Circumstances, be especially attended to, and the Violation thereof punished with the utmost Severity.
