THEREAS Information has been received that an infectious Diftemper prevails in the City of Charlestown, in the State of South Carolina : in the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia; and at New Orleans, in the Territory of Louisiana : And whereas by an Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for erecting a Lazaret " on Chetney-Hill, in the County of Kent, and for " reducing into one Act the Laws relating to Qua-" rantine, and for making further Provision therein;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That it shall be lawful for His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by His Royal Proclamation from Time to Time, to declare any infectious Diftemper, the Communication whereof may be highly danger. ous to the Health of His Majelty's Subjects, to be of the Nature of the Plague, His Majelty, in pur. fuance of the faid Powers, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth deem it expedient to declare, and doth hereby declare, that the faid infectious Diftemper is of the Nature of the Plague, and doth adjudge it probable that fuch infectious Dif temper may be brought to Great Britain, and the Ifles of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, and Man, from the Ports and Places hereinafter-mentioned; and His Majelty doth therefore hereby order, that all Ships, Veffels, Perlons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizesnow arrrived, or which may hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of Great Britain, or the Isles of Guernfey, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Charleftown, in the State of South Carolina; from the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia; or from New Orleans, in the Territory of Louisiana; or from any Port within the faid States of South Carolina and Georgia, or the Territory of Louisiana, and shall have cleared out from any of the faid Ports or Places fubsequent to the First Day of September last, (not having any Perfon or Perfons on board the fame ill of the faid infectious Diffemper,) do perform a Quarantine of Fiftcen Days, at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules prefcribed, by His Majelty's Orders in Council of the Twenty-ninth of July One thousand eight hundred, and of this Date, for Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediter ranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from any Port or Place on the Coaft of Spain, without the Streights of Gibraltar, 'to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, and arriving with

clean Bills of Health; but in cafe it shall appear upon the Arrival of any Ship or Veffel at any of the Ports of Great Britain, or of the Islands aforefaid, which shall have cleared out subsequent to the faid First Day of September last from any of the Ports or Places before mentioned within the Territory of the United States of America; that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the fame, are actually ill of fuch infectious Diftemper. or any of the Crew or Paffengers on board any fuch Ship or Veffel shall have died of the faid infectious Diftemper, or have been ill of the fame, during the Courfe of the Voyage, the Clothes and all perfonal Effects, which are fulceptible of Infection, worn by, or belonging to fuch Perfon, shall be forthwith burned, or funk in deep Water; and the faid Ship or Veffel, with the Whole of her Cargo, shall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place, except at Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place, at which the fame has arrived, or shall arrive as aforefaid, and shall repair to Standgate Creek, and there perform Quarantine, and not elfewhere; and be fubject to all the Rules and Regulations to which Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from Cadiz, or other Ports of Spain, without the Streights of Gibraltar, to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, and not furnished with clean Bills of Health, are subject :- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General, and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors, or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may. respectively appertain.
