" from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after se the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace; His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-feventh Day of June laft, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, from the Eighth Day of August laft, the Importa-tion of fundry Articles of Provisions therein specified Duty free; and whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permiffion should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow. and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Eighth Day of this inftant November, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether falted or otherwife ; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Per-fons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; pro-vided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforefaid, that fhall be fo imported, with the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port where the fame still be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above-recited Act .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. Then, by the Sovereign's Command, the Honorable Major-General Ludlow was introduced into the Prefence between Sir David Dundas and Sin John Colpoys, the Two junior Knights Companions prefent, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order, with the accuftomed Reverences.

The Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by Lord Henley, the fecond Knight in Se-niority prefent, and Major-General Ludlow, kneeling, was knighted therewith :- Then His Royal Highnefs the Duke of York, the fenior Knight, prelented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign; and His Majefty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invelted, had the Honor to kils His Majefty's Hand.

Major-General Moore was afterwards introduced, knighted, and invefted with the fame Ceremonies; and he having likewife kiffed His Majefty's Hand, the Procession returned in the Order abovementioned.
