AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 22d of November 1804,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, That the Order in Council issued on the Fifth of this instant November, for proroguing the Parliament from Tuesday the Twenty seventh Day of this instant November to Thursday the Third January next be discharged; and that the Parliament be prorogued from Tuesday said Twenty-seventh Day of November to Tuesday the Fifteenth Day of January next: And the Right Honorable the Lord High Chancellor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, is to cause a Commission to be prepared in the usual Manner for proroguing the Parliament accordingly.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-seventh Day of this instant November, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Twenty-seventh Day of this instant November to Tuesday the Fifteenth Day of January, One thousand eight hundred and five: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Fifteenth Day of January, One thousand eight hundred and five, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at

Westminster on the said Fifteenth Day of January, One thousand eight hundred and five.

Given at Our Court, at the Queen's Palace, the Twenty-second Day of November One thousand eight hundred and four, in the Forty-fifth Year of Our Reign.
