HEREAS Information has been received, that an Embargo has been ordered to be laid upon all British Ships in the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, It is this Day ordered by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, That no Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of Spain until futher Order; and His Majesty is further pleased to order, That a General Embargo or Stop be made of all Spanish Ships and Vessels whatsoever, now within, or which hereafter shall come into, any of the Ports, Harbours, or Roads within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all Perfons and Effects on board the faid Ships and Vessels; but that the utmost Care be taken for the Preservation of all and every Part of the Cargoes on board any of the faid Ships, fo that no Damage or Embezzlement whatever be sustained: -And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may re-Steph. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able

Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themselves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Ablebodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirtyfive nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thousaud eight hundred and three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit 4 to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be pro-Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every longed and extended from the faid Thirty-first

Day of this instant December to the Thirty-sirst Day of December One thousand eight hundred and five, inclusive; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Sixth Day of June last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of this infant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of this instant December, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Aminunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vellel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incur-ting and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of 'His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower "His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of "His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of "Sak-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respec-Steph. IT IS MAJESTY doth hereby direct and require,
It that all the Private Men on the Out-Peufion

His Majesty is graciously pleased to declare, that all the said Private Men shall be considered as entitled to the Pension for the Six Months commencing from Christmas next, notwithstanding those found sit for Service will commence Pay from the respective Days of their Appearance, in pursuance of this Order.

His Majesty is further pleased to declare, that every Man found fit for Duty shall be entitled, on his joining the Corps to which he shall be appointed, to receive a Bounty of One Pound Five Shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain after supplying him with proper Necessaries; and those who, on Examination, are found unfit for any Duty, shall be dismissed, with proportionate Subsistence to earry them back to their Homes: And it is also His Majefty's gracious Intention, that every Out-Penfioner received, in Conformity to this Order, into a VETERAN BATTALION, shall be entitled, when discharged therefrom, to the increased Allowance of Nine Pence per Diem, provided they are recom-mended by their Colonels or Commanding Officers as Objects deserving of His Majesty's Royal Bounty.

And it is hereby notified, that all the Private Men on the Out-Pension of Chelsea-Hospital, refiding in South Britain, exclusive of Wales, discharged as aforefaid, (except as above excepted,) who shall not appear at the Times and Places herein appointed, will be considered by Government as otherwise provided for, or as dead, and they will accordingly be struck off the Books of the Out-Pension of the said Hospital, without any Prospect of

being reflored thereto.
