WHEREAS Information has been received, W HEREAS Information has been received, that an Embargo has been ordered to be 'laid upon all British Ships in the Ports of the King-dom of Spain, It is this Day ordered by His Ma-igefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, That no Ships or Veffels belonging to any of His Majefty's Subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of Spain until futher Or-der; and His Majefty is further pleafed to order, That a General Embargo or Stop be made of all Spanish Ships and Veffels what sever, now within, or which hereafter shall come into, any of the Ports, Harbours, or Roads within the United Kingdom of AGreat Britain and Ireland, together with all Perfons and Effects on board the faid Ships and Veffels; sbut that the utmost Care be taken for the Preferva-stion of all and every Part of the Cargoes on board any of the faid Ships, fo that no Damage or Em-*bezzlement whatever be fultained :--And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necellary Directions herein, as to them may re-Ipectively appertain. W HEREAS His Majelty was gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bear-sing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thouland reight hundred and three, to promite and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, thould be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Thirtieth clufive of Wales, whether difcharged from the Re-

A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 19th of December 1804, PRESENT. or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, should re-ceive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously meased by His Royal Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Scventh Day of March Ore thousaud eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefly's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majefty's Sea-Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Pro-clamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby ao-cordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Pay-ment of the faid Bounties and Reward be pro-longed and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this inflant December to the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and five, inclusive; whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves accordingly.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the follow-ing Abstracts of Ads of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His breacht Matcher for Arematica Call Barding His prefent Majefty, for preventing fuch Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them : And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of theje Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Infiruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or ManufaQurers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. F any Perlon shall contract with, entice, or solicit, 1 any Artificer-in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having 'been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Diferetion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

"If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any luch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perlon authorifed by fuch Ambaflador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Deicent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection:

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majeky's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-faid, fuch Juitice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before

of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Selfious: And if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Astificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at Weftminfter, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impri-forment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in cafe of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending thall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin refpectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue

fome other Juffice; and if it final appear by the Oath † jefty's Warehouses, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty. and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

> If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ircland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Veffel, he shall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majetty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

> If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Export-ing of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

> One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Ule of the Perlon who shall fue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefly. BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Preis, Paper, Utenfil, or Implement whatfover, ufed in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof ; and all Captains of Shipa and other Perfons receiving or being in Polleffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cultom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are refpectively liable to the like Penakics as are above-mentioned, in the cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
