WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-seventh Day of June last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of January next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of January next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Okum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Com-

missioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS Information has been received, that an Embargo has been ordered to be laid upon all British Ships in the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain, It is this Day ordered by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, That no Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of Spain until further Order; and His Majesty is further pleased to order, That a General Embargo or Stop be made of all Spanish Ships and Vessels whatsoever, now within, or which hereafter shall come into, any of the Ports, Harbours, or Roads within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all Persons and Effects on board the said Ships and Vessels; but that the utmost Care be taken for the Preservation of all and every Part of the Cargoes on board any of the said Ships, so that no Damage or Embezzlement whatever be sustained:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and three, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thousand eight hundred and three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or

themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first Day of this instant December to the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and five, inclusive; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Sixth Day of June last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of this instant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of this instant December, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden

of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War; are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

HIS MAJESTY doth hereby direct and require, that all the Private Men on the Out-Pension of Chelsea-Hospital, residing in South Britain, exclusive of Wales, whether discharged from the Re-

gular Cavalry, Foot Guards, or Infantry of the Line, or from the Militia or Fencibles, (those resident in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, who are to attend at Chelsea on such Days as the Commissioners of the said Hospital shall appoint, the Out Pensioners from the late Horse Guards and Horse Grenadier Guards, the Life Guards, and Royal Regiment of Horse Guards; such Men as, by the Hospital Books, are now more than Fifty-five Years of Age, or had served Twenty-five Years in the Army previously to their Discharges; those who have lost a Limb, or their Eyesight, or are Cripples, or who received a Certificate of their total Unfitness for further Service from any of the Officers employed at the General Examination of Out-Pensioners in the Month of December 1802, excepted,) do personally appear at the Places and on the Days hereinafter-mentioned, in order that such of them as, on Examination, shall be found fit, may be appointed to a ROYAL VETERAN BATTALION:

His Majesty is graciously pleased to declare, that all the said Private Men shall be considered as entitled to the Pension for the Six Months commencing from Christmas next, notwithstanding those found fit for Service will commence Pay from the respective Days of their Appearance, in pursuance of this Order.

His Majesty is further pleased to declare, that every Man found fit for Duty shall be entitled, on his joining the Corps to which he shall be appointed, to receive a Bounty of One Pound Five Shillings, or so much thereof as shall remain after supplying him with proper Necessaries; and those who, on Examination, are found unfit for any Duty, shall be dismissed, with proportionate Subsistence to carry them back to their Homes: And it is also His Majesty's gracious Intention, that every Out-Pensioner received, in Conformity to this Order, into a VETERAN BATTALION, shall be entitled, when discharged therefrom, to the increased Allowance of Nine Pence per Diem, provided they are recommended by their Colonels or Commanding Officers as Objects deserving of His Majesty's Royal Bounty.

And it is hereby notified, that all the Private Men on the Out-Pension of Chelsea-Hospital, residing in South Britain, exclusive of Wales, discharged as aforesaid, (except as above excepted,) who shall not appear at the Times and Places herein appointed, will be considered by Government as otherwise provided for, or as dead, and they will accordingly be struck off the Books of the Out-Pension of the said Hospital, without any Prospect of being restored thereto.

The Affidavit, drawn according to the above Form, dated and attested by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and sent by the General Post, directed thus: " To the Right Hon. the Paymaster-General, at the Horse Guards, London." And Counterparts, or Duplicates of the said Affidavits, are to be reserved by the Out-Pensioners respectively, to be exhibited to such Persons as shall be directed to pay them, that they may be satisfied that all such as may claim Out-Pensions are the real Persons entitled to receive the same.

And, to the End, that the Commissioners for the Affairs of Chelsea Hospital, may be satisfied that the Pensioners are the same Persons who have passed their Examination, it is hereby further directed that such of them who have served in, and have been discharged, from any of the Regiments or Independent Companies of Invalids, are not to mention in their Affidavits such Regiment or Company of Invalids, in which they served last, but the Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army from which they were first discharged and recommended, and received at Chelsea Hospital.

And as the general Payments in Great Britain and Ireland, at the End of the ensuing Six Months, are generally regulated by the Places of Residence mentioned by the Pensioners, who are mustered at Chelsea in Person, and in the Body of the Affidavits of those who live at a Distance, it is hereby ordered and directed, that no Person who shall change the Place of his Abode given in at his Muster, or specified in his Affidavit aforesaid, and who may apply for his Pension (excepting to the Officers of Excise nearest such Place of Abode), shall receive the same, unless it appears, by the Certificate of respectable Persons, that such Removal was through unavoidable Necessity, which he or they could not foresee or prevent.

It is also hereby notified, that none will be entered upon the Pay-Lists of the said Hospital, or be entitled to receive any Benefit therefrom, who shall not act agreeably to these Orders and Directions.

And His Majesty having been pleased, upon this Occasion, to order an Examination of all the Out-Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, resident in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, who have been discharged from their Regiments as Private Men, as well from the Cavalry, Foot Guards, and Infantry of the Line, as from the Militia and Fencibles, (the Out-Pensioners from the late Horse Guards and Horse Grenadier Guards, the Life Guards, and Royal Regiment of Horse Guards; such Men as, by the Hospital-Books, are now more than Fifty-five Years of Age, or had served Twenty-five Years in the Army previously to their Discharges; those who have lost a Limb, or their Eyesight, or are Cripples, or who received a Certificate

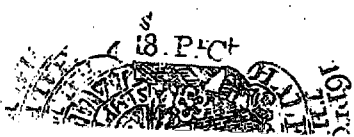
