A PROCLAMATION, For a General Faf.

GEORGE R.

M/E, taking into Our most ferious Consideration the just and necessary War in which We are «engaged, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms, both by :Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with "the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a public Day of Faffing and Humiliation be obferved throughout those Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Wednef-. day the Twentieth Day of February next enfuing, what fo both We and Our People may humble Ourrfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and stolemn Manner fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefly, for averting those : heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations shave most justly deferved ; and for imploring His Bleffing and Affiftance on Our Arms for the Keftoration of Peace, and Profperity to Us and Our Doaminions : And We do strictly charge and command, - that the faid Public Faft be reverently and devoutly -observed by all Oursloving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; . and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly rinflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Persformance of fo religious and neceffary a Duty : And, for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Moft Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose .a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occafion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Public Worship, and to take Care that the same

be timely difperfed throughout their respective Diocefes.

WE, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a public Day of Fassing and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thuriday the Twenty-first Day of February next enfuing, that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and, in the most devout and solemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deferved; and for imploring His Bleffing and Affiltance on Our Arms, for the Reftoration of Peace, and Prosperity to Us and Our Dominions : And We do firicily charge and command, That the faid public Faft be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may jully inflict on all fuch as
