the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 19th of December 1804,

PRESENT,

'The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-feventh Day of June laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, 'Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, 'Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of January next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be con-tinued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of January next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do thip or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Okum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and ob-tained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and " more effectually to prevent the Exportation of * Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when pro-* bibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be con-firued to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necel-fary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majetty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majetly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coait of Africa, or to the Island of

St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Ex-portation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-pofes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards aud Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weit Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa. or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majelty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Committioners; and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were en-tered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
