THEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vitled in His Majesty by an Act, passed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act "for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May One st thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Caif-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool " (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British " or Irish Ships;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and four, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of October last, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, droffed or un-. dreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), on the Ditties Decified in the faid Order; And whereas it is sjudged expedient that the daid Permillion should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of this Instant, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horas, or Pieces of Horns, Tallew, and Wool (except-Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel with any of the Articles above mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like + Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. MEREAS His Majesty has received Infor-VV mation that the King of Spain has issued a Declaration of War against His Majesty, His Subjects, and People; His Majesty, therefore, being determined to take such Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honor of His Crown, and for the vigorous Profecution of the War in which He finds himself engaged, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprisals be granted against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the King of Spain, so that as well His Majesty's Fleets and Ships, as also all other Ships and Velfels that shall be commissionated, by Letters of Marque, or General Reprifals, or otherwise, by His Majetty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully feize all Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to the King of Spain, or his Subjects, or others inhabiting within the Territories of the King of Spain, and bring the same to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions; and, to that End, His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Com-million, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorifing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprisals to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others whom the said Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing, and taking the Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to Spain, and the Vassels and Subjects of the King of Spain, or any inhabiting within His

Countries, Territories, or Dominions; and that such Powers and Clauses be inferted in the faid Commission, as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents; and His Majelty's faid Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commillion, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorifing the faid Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, his Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprifals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same; and, according to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Goods as shall belong to Spain, or the Vassals and Subjects of the King of Spain, or to any others inhabiting within any of his Countries, Territories, and Dominions; and that fuch Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents; and they are likewise to prepare and lay before His Majesty at this Board a Draft of such Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's foreign Governments and Plantations for their Guidance herein; as also another Draft of Instructions for fuch Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purposes afore-mentioned. That a public Day of Faiting and Humiliation be observed throughout those Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Wednesday the Twentieth Day of February next ensuing, that so both We and Our People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and solemn Manner send up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring His

Bleffing and Affifiance on our Arms for the Restoration of Peace, and Prosperity to Us and Our Dominions: And We do strictly charge and command, that the said Public Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of such Punishment as We may justly instict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty: And, for the better and more orderly folemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Public Worship, and to take Care that the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Dioceses.

J.E., taking into Our most serious Consideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God that He will graciously bless Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have resolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a public Day of Fasting and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Thursday the Twenty first Day of February next ensuing, that so both We and Our People may humble Ourselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and, in the most devout and solemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majelty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Provocations have most justly deserved; and for imploring His Bleffing and Af-fishance on Our Arms, for the Restoration of Peace, and Prosperity to Us and Our Dominions: And We do strictly charge and command, That the faid public Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of such Punishment as We may justly inslict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty: Our Will is, therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation seen, ye forthwith proceed to the Market Crois of Edin-burgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the same published; and We do appoint them to : fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, and that, upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being feated, the Register, in the Absence of the Chancellor, read a new Statute, by which it is ordained, that the said Order shall henceforth consist of the Sovereign and Twenty-five Knights Companions, together with such lineal Descendants of the late Sovereign. King George the Second, as shall have been elected, and may hereafter be elected, into the same, always excepting the Prince of Wales, who is a constituent Part of the original Institution.

The Register then signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for filling up the vacant Stalls in St. George's Chapel at Windsor; and as, by the Statutes, none but a Knight can be elected, Garter was commanded to introduce the Duke of Beausort, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State: The Marquis of Abercorn, the Earl of Fembroke and Montgomery, the Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, and the Earl of Chesterfield, were thereupon successively introduced, and knighted with the like Ceremonies.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the Election; and the Suffrages being collected by the Register, and presented to the Sovereign, Henry Charles Duke of Beausort was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected. His Grace was

thereupon received at the Door of the Chapter-Room by the Two junior Knights Companions, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter bearing the Enfigns of the Order on a Cushion.

Garter presenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majesty, affisted by the Two senior Knights Companions, buckled it on His Grace's Left Leg, the Register pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then presented the Ribband with the George to the Sovereign; and, his Grace kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Assistance of the said Two senior Knights Companions, put it over His Grace's Shoulder, the Register, in the mean Time, pronouncing the Admonition; and His Grace having kissed His Majesty's Hand, and saluted the Knights present, withdrew:

After which John James Marquis of Abercorn, George Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery, George Earl of Winchilsea and Nottingham, and Philip Earl of Chestersield were severally elected, and invested with the like Ceremonies.

The Chapter ended, Garter called over the Knights, and a Procession was made back to His Majesty's Apartment in the Order as before.

LONDON DOCKS. BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAN-JESTY'S TREASURY.

Hereas by an Act passed in the Fortieth VV Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for making Wet Docks, Basons, " Cuts, and other Works for the greater Accom-"modation and Security of Shipping, Commerce, and Revenue, within the Port of London " It is enacted, That from and after Notice of the Completion of the faid Docks should be given by public Advertisement in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers usually circulated in London, there should be payable and paid to the faid Company, or to their Collectors or Depaties for their Use for every Ship or Vessel entering into the faid Docks, the several Rates or Duties therein mentioned: And whereas by another Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His said present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for " permitting certain Goods imported into Great
" Britain, to be fecured in Warehouse without pay-" ment of Duty:" It is enacted, That it should be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (B), and which should be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the London Dock Company, in any Warehouse or Warehouses erected or to be erected, fituated within the Premises belonging to the London Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Customs or Excife due on the Importation thereof, subject neverthless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions therein contained; provided that no such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize should be so lodged, or secured, unless and until fuch Warehoules and other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, should be so far compleated that, in the Judgment of the Lord High reasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the same should be fit and proper, in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions in the said Act contained; and the said Lord High Trea-furer, or Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, were thereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand, or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of fuch Warehouses, which Certificate should be published Three Times, at least, in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers usually circulated in London. And whereas the Table marked B, above referred to, is in the Words following; viz. Table (B)
