WHEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vefted W in His Majefty by an Act, paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act "for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May One "thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation "of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool " (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign Ships, on Pay-" (except Cotton wool), in Foreign Snips, on Fay-"ment of the like Duties, as if imported in Britilh " or Irifh Ships;" His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and four, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of October last, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or un-dreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), on the Duties fpecified in the faid Order: And whereas it is indged expedient that the faid Derriffer for the judged expedient that the faid Permiffion fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Moinths, to com-mence from the Twenty-third Day of this Inftant, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed. Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, duroffed or undreffed, Horne or Pieces of Skins, dreffed or undreffed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Veffel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Fo-reign Ship or Veffel with any of the Atticles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the fame Duties of Cufto Entry on rayment of the same Duties of Cul-toms and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
