Rivers; so that though we do not hear our Ele-Etor has any defign of offending others, yet will be in a condition not to be liable to be offended himself. It is said here, that Prince Evuis was contracted to the Princess Radzeville in Prussia on the second instant, and that the Marriage may Toon follow, but the time is not yet certain. The Plague at Leipsicke and Dresden, decreases very confiderably; and it is hoped, that this winter, which is like to prove a very hard one, will free those places from the Infection. Lieutenant Gen ral Spaen parted hence some days since for the Country of Cleves; and the reason of his having staid so long here, was, the Duke of Zells refufing him a pass to go through his Countreys; so that he was forced to go through Maegdeburg, where there is yet some small appearance of the Plague. Here is much discourse of the Comet which have been lately scen; and this Evening we have had much lightening here.

Stratburg, Decemb. 22. There is at present little to write from hence, unless we repeat what we have so often told you, concerning the great preparations that are making, and the apprehenous we have here of them. Our last Letters from Ratisbonne gige us an account. That it had been proposed at the Dyet, that the Imperial Chamber eaght to be removed from Spire, to some place of greater security; and that the Deputies seemed all of an opinion, that it was a thing very necessary, though they had not yet taken any formal resorbution in it.

Hamburg, Decemb. 23. The Magistrates of Leipsicke have acquainted the Neighboring Towns, that they Plague is wholly ceased in their City, and desire they will repew their Trade with them. We have nothing new shom Sweden or Denmark, those Northern Crowns have a very good correspondence; and the reports that were spread abroad, as if the King of Denmark had a realousie of the preparations that were making by the King of Sweden to put his Army, and his Navy into a pollure, do now sufficiently appear to be groundless. There is now much discourse again of the likelyhood there is, that the Crown of Poland will enter into a War against the Turks, we shall know when the Pyet meets, what that Kingdom will do.

Cologne, Decemb. 27 On Friday last arrived here the Baron de Loyen, Envoy of the Elector of Mentz, who has had Andience of our Elector. From Strasburg th y write, that they very much fear a new War in the Spring, and that vast Magazines are providing by the French at Schlestadt and other places. And that the Baron de Monclar, the French Kings Lientenant General in Alface, had commanded all the principal Officers to repair to Brifac, to be employed in. And from Francfort they were to be employed in. And from Francfort they write, that the Bishop of Wurssburg apprehending the French may bave a design upon Phillipsburg, which covers his Territories, had lent thither 400 Dragoous, and 400 Poots, to reinforce the Garrison.

Bruffels, Decemb. 31. His Highness is now pretty well recovered, but still keeps his bed; However this night he is to give Audience to Mon-

ficur de Corfell, Intendent of Tournay, who arrived here yellerday in quality of Envoy from the French King: what his errand is, we as yet know not, though it's feared it may be some new demand. The Count d' Archinto is still at Antwerp, but we expect him back in two or three days; for this is the day appointed by that people to give their final answer in the matter of the subsidies. The States of Brabani proceed in adjusting their proportion of the aydes; yet we must expect the re-solution of those of Antwerp, before theirs can be made effectual. The Nations of this City are again Affembled, in Order to the renewing of the Imposts; but before they will consent to it, defire his Highness to promise them that none be exempted from the said Imposts, either Forreigners or others. In the mean time the Troops of this Province, and some of the Generals, have received à Months pay, and it's believed the general Reform will foon follow. Mr. Legg having had his Audience of Leave of his Highness, parted hence yesterday for Germany. The Marquis de Burgamenero is ftill here.

Paru, Fan. 1. We are told that the King is going to augment his Troops, and that Commissions are preparing for the Raising 20000 Men. The King has given the Government of Thionville, vacant by the death of the Mareschal de Grancey, to the Sieur de Casaux. The Spanish Ambassador has complained of an Hossility committed by some French Troops in Luxemburg, who attacked a Cassile belonging to the Prince of Chemay, though they did not take it, some Spanish Troops being privately gotten into the Place before; but several Soldiers were killed on both sides. People here begin to talk of an approaching War, which, by the preparations that are making, and the Orders that are given to raise Men, and buy Horses, seem to give them some ground for.

Pendennis, Decemb. 26. On Monday last, the wind being at West North West, the Leopard Frigat, together with several Merchant men, Sayled to their several Ports. Since came into this Harbour the Olive-Branch of Topsham, 150 Tuns, 14 Guns, and 23 men, John Tringmore Master, with Fruits from Malago, bound home, also the Phanix of Topsham, Thomas Lovell, with Salt for a Market.

Falmouth, Decemb. 27. The Olive-Branch of Topflam together with 18 Merchant Ships more, under the Convoy of the Sweepstakes and Mermaid Frigats, arrived here the 23d instant from the Streights; they tell us, that about a fortnight since they met with the English Elect of Merchant men, bound for the Streights, off of the Southern Cape, and that they supposed the rest of the Ficet that came in company with them, are going up the Chaunel
