A PROCLAMATION. :GEORGE R.

W HEREAS alarming Accounts have been received that a: Infections Difeale (which, with a Malignancy equalling if not exceeding that of the Plague, has occafioned a dreadful Mortalityin feveral Parts of Spain, and in Our Town and Garrifon of Gibraltar) has fpread and extended itfelf to Parts of the Coaft of the Mediterranean; And whereas, from the Seafon of the Year in which it has continued its Ravages in those Places where it has already appeared, there is no good Ground of Confidence or Hope that the comparative Coldness and the Temperature of this Climate can afford any Obstacle to its Introduction and Progress in Our Kingdom:

And whereas we feel it to be incumbent upon Us to employ fuch Means as, under the Protection and Favour of Divine Providence, may be best calculated to guard Our loving Subjects against the Visitation of fo dreadful a Calamity, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do herein, by and with the Advice of Our faid Council, molt Arichly enjoin and command all Our loving Subjects, and more especially those residing at any of the Sea-. Port Towns, or in any other Places on the Coafts of this Kingdom, whether they may themfelves be liable . toQuarantine or otherwife, as they tender the Prefervation of their own Lives, and the Safety and Wel--fare of all the Inhabitants of this Kingdom, most fcrupuloufly to observe all the Laws of Quarantine which now are or may hereafter be in Force, and all Orders made by Us, with the Advice of Our Brivy Council, or by Our Privy Council, under the Au-thority thereof; and particularly molt carefully to avoid any Communication with any Ship or Veffel, or with any Perfon or Perfons coming therein, from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Weft Bar-. bary, on the Atlantic Ocean, or from Cadiz, or other Parts of Spain without the Streights, lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, or from any Place to which, by Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Orders in Council, the Laws of Quarantine are, or may hereafter, be extended ; or with any Boat or Perion 1

therein, coming from or having been on board any fuch Ship, until fuch Ship, Veffel, or Boat, with the Crews and Perfons on board, and the Goods, Wares, and Merchaudizes imported therein, fhall have performed their Quarantine, in fuch Places and Manner as are or fhall hereafter be directed in that Behalf, and until they refpectively fhall have been duly difcharged therefrom : And We do further ftrictly exhort, enjoin, and command all Magiltrates and Perfons in Authority, and all others Our loving Subjects, without Lofs of Time, to give Information to Us, through Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or to Our Privy Council, of any Perfons that they may know or believe to have offended againft any of the faid Laws or Orders; and We do hereby warn all Perfong whom it may concern, that We have given the ftricteft Orders for enforcing, with the utmolt Rigour, the molt punctual Obfervance of the Laws of Quarantine, and all the Orders, Rules, and Regulations relating thereto, it being Our firm Determination, upon ferious Confideration of the great Extent of Milery and Calamity which a fingle Inflance of improvidently neglecting any of thefe Regulations may bring upon Our loving Subjects, to caufe the feveral Penalties which the Law has provided, or may provide, to be inflicted upon all thole who may be guilty of any Offence againft the fame:

And whereas it is also neceffary to take the utmost Precaution to prevent the spreading of Infection, in cafe the faid malignant Difeafe, or any other of a contagious Nature, (which God, in His Mercy, avert!) should unhappily manifelt itself in any Part of Our United Kingdom, notwithstanding the Precautions taken to guard against the Introduction thereof, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our faid Council, to take Measures for the Establishment of a Board of Health, to confist of Men able, learned, eminent, and experienced in the Study and Practice of Physic, together with Perfons most capable, from their Knowlege of the Ports of Our Kingdoms, to afford Affistance in the forming of Regulations respectively applicable to the local Circumstances of the faid Ports; fuch Board to be authorized and directed to prepare and digest the best Rules and Regulations for the speriod guard of guarding against the Introduction and spreading

of Infection, and for purifying any Ship or Houle, or any Place in which any contagious Diforder may have manifelted itfelf, and to communicate the fame to all Magistrates, Medical Perfons, and others of Our loving Subjects, who may be defirous, and may apply to be made acquainted therewith; and We most strictly enjoin and command all Magistrates and Perfons in Authority, all Medical Perfons, and others Our loving Subjects, efpecially those within the Maritime Counties, to give immediate Notice to Us, through Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or Our Privy Council, in cafe any Perfon or Perfons should be attacked with any Fever, attended with new and uncommon Symptoms, luch as to afford Ground for Apprehension that luch Fever is of the same Nature as the Diforder prevailing in feveral Parts of Spain, and in Gibraltar, in order that the most immediate and effectual Measures may be taken, as well for affording due and neceffary Affiftance and Relief to those afflicted with the fame, as for preventing the Conta-gion from spreading amongst Our loving Subjects.

A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh of March One thousand eight hundred and three, We were pleafed, amongft other Things, to promife and declare that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, tit to ferve on board Our Ships, should be paid to any Perlon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhould be taken for Our Service by any of Our Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirteenth Day of April then next : And whereas the Time limited for the Payment of the faid Reward has been, by feveral Or-ders in Council, prolonged to the Thirty-fift Day of December next, inclusive : And whereas We have, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, thought it expedient and neceffary for the public Service that the faid Reward should be increased, We do hereby promife and declare, by and with the Advice of Our faid Council, that a Reward of Three Pounds for every Able Scaman, and Fifty Shiilings for every Ordinary Seamen, fit to ferve on board Our Ships, shall be paid to any Perfon who thall difcover any fuch Seaman or Seamen refpectively, who may conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service by any of Our Sca-Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the faid Thirty firlt Day of December next, inclusive; the faid Rewards to be paid for any fuch Seaman or Seamen refpectively, fo difcovered and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, and at the Out-Ports, by the Naval Officers (where there are any); and (where there are no Naval Of-ficers) by the Collectors of Our Cuftoms, imme-

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diately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors refpectively, by the Perfon who may make Difcovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names, and Number and Quality of Seamen 'procured in Confequence of his Difcovery; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vefted VV in His Majetty by an Act, paffed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May One " thousand eight hundred and sive, the Importation " of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign Ships, on Pay-" ment of the like Duties, as if imported in British " or Irifh Ships;" His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twentieth Day of September One thouland eight hundred and four, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of October laft, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or un-dreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), on the Duties fpecified in the faid Order: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permiffion fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majelly is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of this Inftant, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Veffel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Fo-reign Ship or Veffel with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the fame Duties of Cuftoms and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Veffel .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly. IR,

HAVE the Honor to enclose, for the Information, of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter to me from Captain Poyntz, of the Melampus, and one from Lieutenant Nicholson, commanding the Frik Cutter, giving Accounts of the Capture of the Enemy's Gun-Veffels, thereinmentioned.

I have the Honor to be, &c. W. CORNWALLIS.

Melampus, off Ufbant, Feb. 13, 1805. SIR HAVE the Honor to inform you, that I, this Morning, fell in with and captured Two Gun-Brigs, carrying Two long Twenty-four-Pounders and One Eighteen-Pounder each, having on board Fifty Men, the greater Part Soldiers; alfo Four Luggers, mounting One long Eighteen-Pounder each, manned with Twenty-five Men, moftly Soldiers

Thefe Veffels are Part of Twenty-feven of the fame Description, from Bourdeaux to Breft; Two more were captured (Lugger rigged) early the fame Morning by the Rhoda and Frisk Armed Cut-ters. I have the Honor to be, &c.

His Majefly's Hired Cutter Frifk, at Sea, 13th February 1805.

SIR, HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that, at Daylight Yefterday, (the Rhoda Cutter in Company,) I difcovered Ten Sail of the Enemy's Gun-Brigs and Luggers had come through the Passage du Raz, and the Wind blowing fresh to the East-ward, they were not able to get to Windward : I immediately gave Chale to the Weathermost, a Lugger, and at half-paft Seven (Point du Raz S. S. W., diftant Five Miles) I captured her, and fent her to Plymouth. She proves to be No. 288, Gun-Veffel, mounting One long 'I wenty-four-Pounder, with Twenty five Men, Twenty of whom are Troops of the 44th Regiment, commanded by Monf. P. Roux, Enseigne de Vaisseaux. At halfpast Eleven the Melampus hove in Sight to Lee-I have the Honor to be, &c. ward.


