NCLOSED I transmit to you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter I have this Day received from Captain Lake, of His Majesty's Ship Topaze, acquainting me of his having captured, on the 13th Instant, in the Latitude 48 Deg. 22 Min. N. Longitude 15 Deg. West, the French Privateer General Angereau, mounting Fourteen Twelve-Pounders, Carronades, and Eighty-eight Men, belonging to Bayonne, which Vessel had been cruising Forty-seven Days without making a Capture.

HAVE the Pleasure to acquaint your Lordship, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command, has this Day captured the French Privateer General Angereau, Ketch-Rigged, mounting Fourteen Twelve-Pounder Carronades, and Eighty-eight Men on board. She is the same Vessel that has been so frequently heard of, and that boarded and carried the William Heathcote West Indiaman. This Cruize she has been out Forty-seven Days without making a Capture.
