Princefs Charlotte, December 13, 1804. SIR, HAVE the Honor to inform you, that at Ten A. M. Cape Antonio, East Four Leagues, made all Sail in Chace of a Brig; and after a hard Chace of Seven Hours, with a fresh Breeze, came up with her in Lat. 20 Deg. 50 Min. N. Long. 85 Deg. 32 Min. W. having fleered South the Whole of the Chace, and firing Four or Five Shot at her fhe flruck, and proves to be the French Privateer Brig Regulus, from Guadaloupe, commanded by Citizen Jacque Mathieu, pierced for Fourteen Guns, but only Eleven mounted, (having thrown Two overboard, with her Boats and Spars in the Chace,) and Eighty four Men. She is a very fine Vellel, fails remarkably well, is coppered, and is, in my Opizion, perfectly adapted for His Majefty's Service. I have the Honor to be, &c. F. F. GARDNER.
