*Cologne, Jan. 3.* Our Magistrates are preparing a Letter to the Emperor, humbly to acquaint him with the Proceedings that have been had here against some of the old Burghermasters, who have employed the publick Moneys that pass through their hands. Mr. *Bertie*, Envoye Extraordinary from the King of *England* is still here, by reason of the weather. It is reported, that besides the Comet, of which so often mention has been made, 10 other Comets have been seen; and that several Fields as big as Lambs have been seen by the Countess *pebble* who say they saw the like in 1672. just before the Wars.

*Brussels, Dec. 31.* The Prince of *Parma* our Governour is much better than he was, and we now expect to see in few days, the great Reform put in execution. The Nations of this City are now assembled to renew the several Impositions, which no person is for the future to be exempted from, for this Highness will take away the Priviledges which several Foreigners that were permitted to live within the precincts of the Court, formerly have had, not to pay the said Duties.

*Hague, January 7.* The Deputies of the States of *Holland* are come to Town again, and to morrow they will Re-assemble: their recess would have been much longer, but that the City of *Amsterdam* desired they would meet after the Holidays, to determine some Matters that are before them, in which that City is particularly concerned; which when they have done, they will its believed Adjourn till *February*.

*Paris, Jan. 8.* The Dauphin is every day more and more re-established in his Health, to the great joy of the Court. Our Letters from *Italy* tell us, that the Cardinal *d'Essee* was arrived in the Ecclesiastical Territories; that he was received every where with great Kindness and Respect, and the expenses of him and his Attendants, were defrayed by order of the Pope.

*Edinburgh, Dec. 30.* The 28th Instant, the Owners and Crew of *Bristol, Michael Parry*, with Sugars for *Boston*, arrived here in 13 weeks from *Jamaica*. The same day came in the *Elizabeth* of *Tinmouth*, *Benjamin Bard*, from *St. Sebastian* with Salt for *Topsam*. Adfortix Vessels of *Yarmouth* with Herrings, for several Ports in *France*; as the Wind being at North-West, they are now under S. it.

*Plymouth, Dec. 31.* This Evening the *King-Fisher*, Capt. *Kemptborn* Cominander, and the *Crown*, Capt. *Lloyd*, with about 20 Sail of the Herring-Fleet under their Convoy, sailed hence for the *Streights*.

*Plymouth, Jan. 2.* This morning His Majesties Ship the *Constant-Warwick*, having on Board Sir *Richard Dutton* (whom His Majesty has appointed to succeed Sir *Fonsaban Atkins* in the Government of *Barbados*, sailed from *Spithead* for the *Barbados*.

*Plymouth, Jan. 4.* This morning the *Sweepstakes* Brigant weighed from *Spithead*, and came into the *Harbour* to rest.

*London, Decemb. 17.* This day by order of the House of Lords, was burnt by the hand of the

Common Hangman, before the *Royal Exchange*, and in the *Palace-yard*, a Paper, Entituled, *A Speech lately made by a Noble Peer of this Realm being a scandalous Libel.*
