P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the malignant Fever which some Time since prevailed in the City of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, in the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia, and at New Orleans, in the Territory of Louisiana, has totally ceased; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being desirous of removing all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth of November last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, subsequent to the First Day of September preceding, should have cleared out from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louisiana, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louisiana, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the Fourteenth of November last had not been made; any Thing in the said Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; provided such Ships and Vessels shall have sailed from the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, or Louisiana subsequent to the First Day of January last, and that none of the Crew or other Persons on board have died, or been sick of the said Fever, during the Course of the Voyage:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the said respective Isles of Guernsey, Jer-

sey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Steph. Cottrell.*

thorised by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, certain Rates and Duties, and to allow certain Drawbacks and Bounties, upon Goods, Wares, and Merchandize imported into and exported from Ireland, in lieu of former Rates and Duties, Drawbacks and Bounties.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, certain inland Duties of Excise and Taxes in Ireland, in lieu of former Duties of Excise and Taxes

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Stamp Duties in Ireland.

An Act for repealing certain Duties upon Letters and Packets sent by the Post within Ireland, and granting other Duties in lieu thereof.

An Act for granting to His Majesty a Duty upon Malt made in Ireland, and upon Spirits made or distilled in Ireland, for the Year One thousand eight hundred and five.
