The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to His Ma-W jelly at this Board, that the malignant Fever which fome Time fince prevailed in the City of Charlefton, in the State of South Carolina, in the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia, and at New Orleans, in the Territory of Louifiana, has totally ceafed; His Majefty, taking the fame into Con-fideration, and being defirous of removing all Re-ftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiltent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majelty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth of November last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, subsequent to the First Day of September preceding, should have cleared out from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louisiana, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louifiana, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Vessels be permitted to dif-charge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Qua-rantine, as freely as they might have done in cafe fuch Order of the Fourteenth of November laft had .not been made; any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithftanding; provided fuch Ships and Veffels shall have failed from the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, or Louifiana fubfequent to the First Day of January last, and that none of the Crew or other Perfons on board have died, or been fick of the faid Fever, during the Course of the Voyage: — And the Right Honor-able the Lords Commissioners of His Majelly's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-Ge-neral, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid respective Isles of Guernsey, Jer-


