PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant Fever which fome Time fince prevailed in the City of Charlelton, in the State of South Carolina, in the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia, and at New Orleans, in the Territory of Louifiana, has to-tally ceased; His Majefty, taking the fame into Con-fideration, and being defirous of removing all Reftraints upon Trade, io far as may be confiltent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majelty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth of November laft, upon all Ships, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, fublequent to the First Day of September preceditig, should have cleared out from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louissana, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this King-dom, or the Illes of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Lonifiana, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Vessels be permitted to dif-charge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Qua-rantine, as freely as they might have done in cafe fuch Order of the Fourteenth of November laft had not been made; any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; provided fuch Ships and Vessels shall have failed from the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, or Louisiana subfequent to the First Day of January last, and that none of the Crew or other Perfons on board have died, or been fick of the faid Fever, during the Course of the Voyage:-And the Right Honor-able the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General, and the reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid respective Isles of Guernsey, Jer-
