completed, that in their Judgment the same were sitted and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament, marked (A), and wherein the same might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act, viz. All those Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses adjoining each other, and situate on the North Side of the large Dock, belonging to the West India Dock Company, at the Isle of Dogs, forming the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declares their Approbation of the said several Warchouses accordingly.

And whereas by the Ninth Section of the faid Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows: "That if the Lord High Treasurer or the Commissioners of His Majeshy's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act Island had be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and still cause, a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construed to extend to such sections, wares, and Merchandize, in every Resis feet in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the faid Tables respectively, at the Time of passing

" this Act." · We the underligned Lords Commillioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to, and in Execution of the Powers vested in us, in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us to be expedient, that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies (excepted in Table (B) and nexed to the said Act); and that all Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, whether the same shall have been shipped on board such Vessels in the West Indies, or elsewhere, may respectively be fafely and fecurely deposited in all or any of the Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses hereinbefore described, and remain therein, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act. And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate, in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all andievery the Provisions, Regulations, and Re-frictions of the faid Act, shall extend, and be conftrued to extend to all such Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inferted and enumerated in Table (A) ... annexed to the said Act at the Time of the palling

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Fortythird Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods "imported into Great Britain, to be fecured in "Warehouses without payment of Duty:" It is enacted, That it should be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (B), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to ledge and fecure the fame under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the London Dock Company, in any Warehouse or Warehouses erected or to be erected, situated within the Premises belonging to the London Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Cultoms or Excise due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions therein contained; provided that no fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize should be so lodged, or secured, unless and until such Warehouses or other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, should be so far compleated that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the fame shall be sit and proper, in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame might re-fpectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions in the faid Act contained; and the faid Lord High Trea-furer, or Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, were thereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand, or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of fuol Warehouses, which Certificate should be published Three Times, at least, in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers usually circulated in London. And whereas the Table marked B, above referred to, is in the Words following; viz. Table (B)

A List of Articles which (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the West Indies) may be secured in Warehouses within the Premises belonging to the London Dock Company, without the Duties due on the Importation thereof being sirst paid,

Rice.
Tobacco.
Wine.
Brandy.
Geneva and other Spirits.

And whereas certain Warehouses and other Parts of the said Works have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and are now in Use: And whereas another Warehouse, Part of the said Works, hath since been compleated as hereinaster mentioned.
