IT is His Majesty's Command that all the Knights of the Thistle, Bath, and St. Patrick, who shall be present at the Installation of the Knights of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, on the Twenty-third Instant, at Windsor Castle, do appear in the Collars of their respective Orders.

Her Majesty will have a Drawing-Room at Eight o'Clock in the Evening, when, as during the Ceremony in the Morning, the Ladies are to be in full Dress, without Hoops, and the Gentlemen in full Dress, or in Naval or Military Uniform.

N. B. The Court will appear out of Mourning on the Occasion; and no Persons will be admitted to St. George's Chapel, or Hall, in Mourning.

ORDERS for the Court to change the Mourning on Sunday the 21st Instant, for the late Queen Dowager of Prussia, viz.

The Ladies to wear black Silk, fringed or plain Linen, white Gloves, Necklaces, and Earrings, black or white Shoes, Fans, and Tippetts.

Undress—white or grey Lutestrings, Tabbies, or Damasks.

The Gentlemen to wear black full-trimmed, fringed, or plain Linen, black Swords, and Buckles.

Undress—grey Frocks.

The Court to change the Mourning further on Sunday the 28th Instant, viz.

The Ladies to wear black Silk or Velvet, coloured Ribbons, Fans, and Tippetts, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver Stuffs, with black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black Coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver Stuff Waistcoats full trimmed, coloured Swords, and Buckles.

And on Sunday the 5th of May the Court to go out of Mourning.
