## Westminster; May 17, 1805.

HIS Day the Lords being fnet, a Mellage was fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Ulher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, au-thorifed by wirtue of His Majefly's Commiffion for de-claring His Royal Affent to feweral Alls agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of 'the Honorable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers to bear the Com-miffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the foid Commiffion empowering the Lord Arch the faid Commission, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for railing the Sum of One Million Five Hundred Thouland Pounds by Way of Annuities, for the Service of Ireland.

An A& to amend the Laws for improving and keeping in Repair the Polt Roads in Ireland, and for rendering the Conveyance of Letters by His Majefty's Post Office more fecure and expeditious.

An AA for reftraining the Negotiation of certain Promiffory Notes and Inland Bills of Exchange in Ireland.

An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, for preventing counterfeiting of certain Silver Coin issued by the Banks of England and Ireland respectively, to Silver Pieces which may be iffued by the Governor and Company of the Bank of Ireland called Tokens, and to promote the Circulation of the faid Tokens.

An Act for confirming the Charter, and enlarging the Powers of the Incorporation, of the Officers of Excife in Scotland

An Act for the Prefervation of Salmon and other Fish in the Rivers in the County of Carmarthen, and County of the Borough of Carmarthen.

An Act for erecting and maintaining a Harbour, Docks, and other Works at Ardroffan, in the County of Ayr.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money for the Improvement of the Harbour of Leith.

Air Act for the making, repairing, lighting, watch-ing, and watering certain Roads from the Borough of Plymouth to Stonehoufe-Bridge and Plymouth-

Dock, in the County of Devon, and for regulating the Stands and Fares of Hackney Coaches and Carts using the fame.

An Act for altering, amending, and confolidating feveral Acts for repairing Turnpike Roads, in the County of Ayr, for repairing other Roads therein, and for making more effectual the Statute Labour in the faid County.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering the Powers of fo much of Two Acts made in the Twelfth and Thirty-fecond Years of His prefent Majelty, as relate to the Road from Ingliston Bridge, by Biggar to Leadhills, and to the Confines of the County of Lanark, and for making and maintaining a Continuation of the faid Road from Dolphinton to the Confines of the County of Edinburgh.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Thirty fecond Year of His late Majefty, To far as the fame relate to the Road leading from Grautham, in the County of Lincoln, to Nottingham Trent Bridge, in the County of Nottingham.

An Act to continue and amend Two Acts paffed the Second and Twenty-fourth Year of His in refer the Second and Twenty-fourth Tear of The prefert Majefty, for repairing the Road from Caftle-Street, at the End of the Town of Hinckley to Lutterworth Town's End, and from the Guide Poft, at Walcot Town's End, in the County of Leicefter, to the Eighty Mile Stone, in Welford Field, in the County of Northampton.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of Two Acts passed in the Second and Twenty-fourth Years of His prefent Majefly for amending the Road from the Turnpike Road, at or near Swindon to Marlborough, and from Marlborough to Everley, in the County of Wilts. And Seventeen Private Acts.
