Rom Coningsberg we have an account of the Marriage of Prince Louis of Brandenburg with the Princel's Radzeville; We are told that the Elector purposes to be himself in Pruffia at the time of the meeting of the Dyet in Poland, whither he is fending the Baron d' Overbecke as his Ambalfador. They write from Poland that all the Provincial Dyets that have been held in the feveral Palatinates, in order to the General Dyet that is appointed to be held at Warfaw, have had a very good conclu-fio; That in most of them it has been proposed, whicher the Crown should enter into a War against the Turks, in conjunction with the Moscov es, and that upon the debate thereof, they had most pat empowered the Deputies they fo r Gen ral Dyet, to act as they shall think ſ t ' y will have those lights given them, fı h . refolutions by, which these Provint . cannot have. At the fame time we are C , the Negotiation concerning an Offensive t Defensiv. Allyance between the Crown of Po+ a land a d the Czar of Mofcovy is still depending, and that it is the general opinion it will be concluted before Spring.,

Lintz, fan. 3. The 30th past the Sieur Stadion, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Mentz, , received from the Emperor the Invellure of the Fiefs which his Electoral Highnels polleffes on account of his Electorate. We are expecting here an Envoy from the Elector Palatine on the fame Subject. The Emperor has appointed Commissioners to treat with the Bilhop of Sebestini and the Hungarian Deputies. They have very frequent conferences, and we are told that there is a great prospect of their bringing things to a happy conclusion; and that a general affembly of the Stares of Hungary will be held at Newstadt, and that there, this great work will be perfected, and that in order thereunto the Emperor means to remove very fuddainly from hence to Vienna. The Sentence against the Count de Zinzendorf late President of the Finances is executed with all feverity, the Emperor having cauled the Count of Newburg, which was part of his Patrimonial Effate to be feized, and the Moneys he payd as a Fine, have been diffributed among the Officers that are making new Leavies.

Strasburg, Jan. 6. Here are feveral Officers' in this Town, who are expecting Commiffions to raife men, fome for the fervice of the Emperor? and others for that of France. We are told that fresh Orders are come from the French Court to halten the fortifications of Germerscheim, and that the ron de Monclar, and the Sigur d' Espel the Ing. fier. are for that purpole gone thither. We are likéwile informed that the faid Baron de Moncler has received Orders from the French King to draw abody of 10005 men together, and to polt them in the Neighborhood of this City, which does not a little encrafe our fears, though fome perfons would remove them, by telling us, that the d.fign of the French, is upon Philipsburg, and that they purpole to put it in execution during this hard froft, which they think will render their Enterprife the more eafie; whether there is any ground for this opinion, is uncertain, but this we know, that upon intimations of this kind the Garrilon of Philipsburg has been lately reinforced.

Strasburg, Jan. 9. The Count of Starenberg, Go-vernor of Philipsburg having been feveral days in this City, whether about private or publick Affairs we know not, returned two days fince to his Government, having received advice from feveral hands, that it behoved him to have a watchful eye upon the motions of the French, for that it is more then probable, they have a defign upon that Fortrefs. All the Bayliffs, Stewards, and other Officers, which the Duke of Deuxponts, the Prince of Veldents the Count de Hanaw, and some other Princes have upon their Lands, are fummond to appear the 10th of this Month before the Soveragin Chamber at Brifac, as depending on Alface, of which the French claim the Sovereignty, and to bring with them their publick Regilters and other Acts which may declare the value of the faid Lands &c. The Prince of Solme who is now at Aix la Chapalle is cited to appear within 40 days before the Chamber at Merz, to do homage for his principality; And the Coun-ty of Falkenslein belonging to the Prince of Vaudemont, is given to the Count of Munderfleir, bccaufe that Prince did not obey a like citation.

Berlin, Decemb. 31. The States-General of the United-Provinces, having upon the feiling of the Spanish Ship in the Road of Oftend, caused a Placaet to be publithed recalling their Subjects out of the fervice of Forreign Princes, our Elector very much refented it, looking upon the intention of that Placaet to be, to render his Maritine defigns fruitlefs, for that his Ships were c'iefly manned with Seamen, and commanded by Officers that were Subjects to the States; fince, upon the reprefentations that have been made concerning this mate ter, the States-General have declared, that such of their Subjects as are in the fervice of his Electoral Highnels, may notwithstanding the faid Placast con-tinue in it; and thereupon Our Elector has put out a *placast*, in which he gives notice of the leave which the Subjects of the states have from th m to remain in his service, and declares if ary of them shall prefume to quit it, without having first obtained his Electoral Highneffes permission fo to dø
