AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 30th of *May* 1805,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for continuing several Laws relating to the permitting the Warehousing of Spirits in Ireland for Exportation, for charging a Duty on the same when taken out for Home Consumption, and for regulating the Exportation to Great Britain of Spirits not warehoused, until the Twenty-ninth Day of September, One thousand eight hundred and five; to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions; and to the permitting the Importation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament; which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and five, shall be, and the same is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and six, His Majesty, in virtue of the Powers vested in Him by the said Acts, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to

allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this His Majesty's Order in Council, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb (except salted Beef and Pork); and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel, belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the said above-recited Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

SIR,

I ENCLOSE herewith, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Barker, commanding His Majesty's Armed Brig Grenada, giving an Account of the Capture of L'Intrepid Privateer.

His Majesty's Brig Grenada,
 March 16, 1805.

SIR,

I HAVE the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that at Two A. M. the Union Island bearing East Six Miles, I discovered a suspicious Vessel to the S. W. and after a Chace of Two Hours came up with and captured the French Privateer Schooner L'Intrepid, commanded by Citoyen Jean Durand, mounting Four Six-Pounders and Sixty-two Men. I have likewise the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that we have not sustained any Loss of Men, as she struck upon receiving a few Shot, and Two or Three Volleys of Musketry. The Privateer was fitted out at Cayenne, and had been Twelve Days at Sea, and not taken any Thing.

SIR,

I HEREWITH forward a Letter from Lieutenant Blow, of the Charger Gun-Brig, inform-

ing me of his having captured One of the Enemy's small Cruizers.

SIR,

I BEG Leave to inform you, for the Information of the Commander in Chief, Orfordness bearing W. N. W. Fourteen Leagues, I captured the De Zenno, a small Cutter Privateer, commanded by Lodwick Pepper, out Two Days from Flushing, but had made no Captures. She had on board Thirteen Men and a Chest of Arms.

Office of the Commissioners appointed by Act of Parliament under the Convention with the United States of America, Great Marlborough-Street, 27th May 1805.

ORDERED—That Notice be published in the London Gazette that the First and Second Instalments under the Convention have now been paid into the Bank of England, in the Names of the Commissioners, pursuant to the Act.

Ordered further—That the following General Order and Resolutions of the Board be in like Manner published in the London Gazette.

July 12, 1804.

Ordered—That all Persons who claim before this Board in the Characters of Executors, Administrators, or other Representatives of Persons deceased, Guardians or Tutors, and Curators of Persons under Age, surviving Partners of Companies under Articles of Partnership or otherwise, Assignees under Commissions of Bankrupt in England, or Trustees for Creditors under the Law of Sequestration in Scotland, hold themselves prepared to exhibit, and, when called upon, to prove their respective Titles to receive and give good and sufficient Acquittances for such Payments as the Board may award, and to make Assignments, if required, as the Act directs; and that such Claimants be apprised, that in all Cases of doubtful or complicated Title, the Board will require to have produced to them the Opinion of His Majesty's Attorney-General, or Solicitor-General, or any one of His Majesty's Counsel, for all Cases under the Law of England, and of the Lord Advocate or Solicitor-General for Scotland, or any one of His Majesty's Advocates Depute there, for all Cases under the Law of Scotland; whereupon the Board will, in every such Case, either admit the Title, or direct such Measures for completing the same as may appear to be necessary.

March 16, 1805.

Resolved—That as soon as the Board, in the Course and Order of Investigation suggested by the different Subjects before them, are in any Case satisfied by the Statements and Evidence adduced, that any considerable Part of the Claim is just, (the Title of the Claimant or Claimants, if within any of the Descriptions set forth in the General Order of the 12th of July last, being shewn to be good in the Manner therein directed,) a Special Adjudication and Order for a Dividend, or Payment in Part, or on Account, will in such Case be made; that as



the Amount of every Dividend, or Payment in Part, or on Account, will be calculated in Proportion to the total Amount of Claims not then rejected, and the Amount of the divisible Fund at the Time, additional Dividends or Payments will afterwards of course be made, in Proportion to the Diminution of the total Amount of Claims, by Rejections or Disallowances, under the Decisions or Adjudications of the Board, or the Increase of the divisible Fund, by the Receipt of another Instalment under the Convention; and that in all Cases where Orders for Dividends or Payments are made, immediate Notice thereof will be given to the Claimants, or their respective Agents, that they may severally attend for the Purpose of receiving the same, on such Terms as the Board, under the Authority of the Act, shall see Cause to prescribe.

March 18, 1805.

Resolved—That in every Case where it shall appear from the subsequent Investigation that a Claimant has, by Means of any Order or Orders from the Board for a Dividend, or Payment in Part, received more than such Claimant was then entitled to receive, the Board, in ascertaining the Amount of the next Dividend, Proportion, or Sum of Money to be paid to the Claimant, will deduct such Excess in the former Payment or Payments, so as that the Amount of the Sums in such Case awarded and received may not, in the Whole, exceed the Compensation to which such Claimant was justly entitled.

27th May 1805.

Resolved—That from the Misapprehensions which still appear to prevail, respecting the Losses for which British Creditors were entitled to exact Compensation under the Fourth Article of the Treaty of Peace, the Sixth Article of the Treaty of Amity, and the Convention, as if Claimants had a Right to Compensation for the Amount of all the Debts which were due to them by Citizens or Inhabitants of the United States at the Peace, and still remain due, it is expedient thus distinctly to declare, what from the obvious Reason of the Case, and plain Terms of the said Articles, as well as the various Notices and Explanations from the Board, might have been inferred, that there never was any ground for claiming Compensation, and that none can be obtained.

1st, For Loss of Debts, however fairly contracted, and still justly due, which were not good at the Peace, or the Period when they might have been recovered, if lawful Impediments had not operated against them.

2dly, For Loss occasioned by Circumstances arising in the Course of the War, such as the Loss of Books, Vouchers, or other Papers, the Effect of which could not be ascribed to any Breach of the Fourth Article of the Treaty of Peace.

3dly, For such Loss arising to Creditors from the Dishonesty or Embarrassments and Speculations of their Debtors, and the Practices of dilatory Litigation, as no Compliance on the Part of the United States with the said Fourth Article of the Treaty of Peace would have prevented.

4thly, For Loss occasioned by such Negligence or Mismanagement, and irrational Conduct in Creditors or their Agents, as shall, on due Consideration of all Circumstances, be held by the Board to come within the Meaning and Description of the Pro-

vision against the Effect of "Negligence and wilful Omission," which was expressly stipulated in Favour of the United States by the said Sixth Article of the Treaty of Amity; and which Provision, wherever it applied, would have barred all Compensation under that Article, and must therefore bar Compensation under the Convention.

And that wherever Loss appears to have arisen from any of the above Causes, the Board will make such equitable Deduction or Allowance, as a fair Construction of the said Sixth Article would have entitled the United States to demand.

Resolved further—That the Conduct of Claimants before the Board, either on the one Hand in fairly disclosing Facts within their Knowledge, and making the necessary Enquiries; or on the other, in concealing or misrepresenting Facts within their Knowledge, and professing total Ignorance of Circumstances, without some Knowledge of which, no precise Claim could ever, from the plain Meaning of the Fourth Article of the Treaty of Peace, the Sixth Article of the Treaty of Amity, and the Convention have been honestly made; or in delaying or abstaining from all Enquiry respecting such Facts as the Notices published so far back as the Year 1797, and repeated, by this Board required, will be held by the Board as strong Evidence, sufficient, in different Degrees, to turn the Course of Presumption and Inference either for or against such Claimants accordingly.

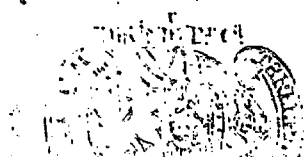
