A T the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, the 23d Day of May 1805,

PRESENT,

The Lords of His Majefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council.

HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Fortyfourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for establishing and maintaining a " permanent Additional Force for the Defence of " the Realm, and to provide for augmenting His " Majefty's Regular Forces, and for the gradual " Reduction of the Militia of England;" it is, among 1 other Things, enacted, That from and after the passing of the faid Act, there shall be raifed in the feveral Counties in England, for the Year ending on the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, towards fupplying the Vacancies that have arifen in fuch Additional Force by reafon of the enlifting of any Perfons ferving therein into His Majefty's Regular Forces, a further and additional Number of Nine Thousand Men: And it is further enacted, That His Majefty's Privy Council shall caufe such Number of Nine Thousand Men to be railed for the fupplying the Vacancies which have arilen from the califting of Men as aforelaid, in the feveral Counties in England, to be apportioned among fuch Counties according to the respective original Quotas of Men required at the Time of making fuch Apportionment to be raifed in fuch respective Counties under the Acts relating to the Militia; and shall, as foon after fuch Apportionment shall have been made as the fame can be done, caufe the Numbers fixed and fettled by fuch Apportionment to be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the feveral Counties in England, or their Vice Lieutenants, and shall also cause Notice thereof to be given in the London Gazette ; and fuch Lieutenants, or Vice Lieutenants, shall immediately fummon General and Subdivision Meetings of Lieutenancy in their refpective Counties ; and the Deputy Lieutenants at fuch Meetings shall divide and ap-

portion the Number fo fixed and fettled among the Hundreds in their respective Counties, and among the feveral Parishes of such Hundreds, according to the Provisions of the feveral Acts relating to the Militia, in order that fuch Men may, as speedily as poffible, be raifed for the Additional Force, under the Provisions of the faid Act, His Majesty's Privy Council, in purfuance of the faid Directions contained in the faid Act, are thereupon pleafed to apportion and divide, and do hereby apportion and divide, over the feveral Counties in England, the Number of Men to ferve for fuch Counties respectively, according to the feveral Numbers specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and amounting, in the Whole, to Eight Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-five Men; and which Schedule His Majefty's Privy Council are pleafed to direct shall be taken as Part of this Order, and they do hereby direct that this Order, and the Schedule thereunto annexed, be published in the London Gazette, and be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the several Counties in England, or their Vice Lieutenants, in order that they should proceed upon the same in pursuance of the Directions of the faid Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Fortyfourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing and maintaining a Parliament.

" permanent Additional Force for the Defence of " the Realm, and to provide for augmenting His " Majeity's Regular Forces, and for the gradual " Reduction of the Militia of Scotland," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That, from and after the paffing of the faid Act, there shall be raifed in the feveral Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, for the Year ending on the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, towards supplying the Vacancies that have arifen in fuch Additional Force, by reafon of the enlifting of any Perfons enrolled therein into His Majefty's Regular Forces, a further and additional Number of One Thoufand Eight Hundred Men: And it is further enacted. That His Majefty's Privy Council shall caufe fuch Number of One Thousand Eight Hundred Men, for the fupplying the Vacancies arifing from the enlifting of Men as aforefaid, to be apportioned among fuch Counties according to the respective original Quotas of Men required at the Time of making fuch Apportionment to be raifed in fuch respective Coun. ties and Stewartries under the Act relating to the Militia; and shall, as foon after fuch Apportionment shall have been made as the fame can be done, caufe the Numbers fixed and fettled by fuch Apportionment to be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the feveral Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, or their Vice Lieutenants, and shall also cause Notice thereof to be given in the Edinburgh Gazette ; and fuch Lieutenants or Vice Lieutenants shall immediately summon General and Subdivision Meetings of Lieutenancy in their respective Counties and Stewartries; and, the Deputy Lieutenants at fuch Meetings shall divide and apportion the Numbers fo fixed and fettled among the Subdivisions, Parifhes, Cities, or Places in their respective Counties and Stewartries, according to the Provisions of any Act relating to the Militia, in order that fuch Men may, as fpeedily as poffible, be raifed for the Additional Force under the Provisions of this Act, His Majefty's Privy Council, in purfuance of the faid Directions contained in the faid Act, are thereupon pleafed to apportion and divide, and do hereby apportion and divide, over the feveral Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, the Number of Men to ferve for fuch Counties refpectively, according to the feveral Numbers specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and amounting, in the Whole, to One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-two Men. and which Schedule His Majefty's Privy Council are pleafed to direct shall be taken as Part of this Order ; and they do hereby direct that this Order, and the Schedule thereunto annexed, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and be transmitted to the refpective Lieutenants of the feveral Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, or their Vice Lieutenants, in order that they fhould proceed upon the fame, in purfuance of the Directions of the faid Act of . .W. A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 30th of May 1805,

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of December laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaffwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service,) do at any Time,

during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled * An " Act to empower His Majelty to prohibit the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the " Law for empowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelty to reftrain the carrying Coastwife of " Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition :"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act " for continuing feveral Laws relating to the per-" mitting the Warehousing of Spirits in Ireland for Exportation, for charging a Duty on the fame when taken out for Home Confumption, and for 6E 66 " regulating the Exportation to Great Britain of " Spirits not warehoused, until the Twenty-ninth Day of September, One thousand eight hundred " " and five; to the prohibiting the Exportation " from, and permitting the Importation to, Great " Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importa-" tion of other Articles of Provision, without Pay-" ment of Duty; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or " other Provisions; and to the permitting the Im-" portation into Ireland of Corn, Fifh, and Provi-\$٢ tions without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-" fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred " and fix ;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majefty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Sellion

of Parliament; which was continued by an A& of [the Thirty ninth and Fortieth Years of His prefent Majesty, and amended and further continued by fe-veral subsequent Acts, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and five, shall be, and the same is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thou-sand eight hundred and fix, His Majesty, in virtue of the Powers vested in Him by the faid Acts, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this His Majefty's Order in Council, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulle; and alfo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb (except falted Beef and Pork); and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheele, Potatoés, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Veffel, belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry fhall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above-recited Act, paised in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majetty :-- And the Right Honorable the Lords Com-miflioners of His Majefty Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly


