The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jesty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of December last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gun-powder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Sasety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsower (except the Master-General of the Ordanace ever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf sirtl obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth
Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An
